WASHINGTON, D. C. - Congressman Omar Burleson, who represents the 17th District of Texas in the United States House of Representatives, has announced for reelection. He has filed for a place on the ballot in the Democratic Primary Election on May 1, 1976.

Burleson was elected to the 80th Congress from the 17th District and has been re-elected to each succeeding Congress. He is a member of the Ways and Means Committee, considered to be the most pow erful and prestigious in the House. In addition, Congressman Burleson serves on the newly created Budget Control Committee which has, as its purpose, relating Federal expenditures to Federal revenues with the goal of reaching a balanced budget.




