Cattlemen's Prexy Wants No Controls

KANSAS CITY, Jan. 5 (AP)—The president of the American National Cattlemen's Assn. said here today that wage and price controls should be "kicked out the window."

The spokesman, Sam C. Hyatt, Hyattville, Wyo., told about 1,600 beef producers from 22 states that "this country must again return to an economy free from the interference of government busybodies."

Hyatt and Stephen H. Hart, Denver, attorney for the National Livestock Tax Committee, spoke at the opening of the cattlemen's annual convention.

Hart said the Internal Revenue Bureau is trying to deprive stockmen of the income tax procedure allowed other taxpayers. He said Congress would be asked to clarify the matter.

Hyatt asserted the slump in live cattle prices was out of proportion to the country's general economy and he laid much of the blame on OPS.

"There is no question but the cost of processing and handling

meat has increased, as has the cost to the producer," Hyatt said. "With OPS restrictions on the packers' and retailers' normal operations, the system of marketing has become rigid and unworkable. It must be flexible to work."

"Price and wage controls are only the dying gasp of the planners and regulators, and if they are not kicked out the window before their expiration date of April 30, certainly they should not be given new life," Hyatt declared.

Hart said the Livestock Tax Committee would try to preserve the cash basis for keeping books and filing tax returns. He said the Internal Revenue Bureau has asked Congress to deprive farmers of this simple method while allowing other taxpayers to follow it.

He said the committee would urge legislation giving farmers tax deferred treatment on livestock sold under threat of drought and seek clarification on treatment of expenditures for soil conservation.

New York Absorbs Bus Strike Easily

NEW YORK, Jan. 5 (AP)—The first full impact of a five-day-old strike being up 3,500 privately-owned buses hit New York City today.

It threw a heavy load on subways and city-owned bus lines during the morning rush hour but they absorbed it without great difficulty.

A mediation session was scheduled at City Hall today.

The strike, which started New Year's Eve, has idled eight private bus companies which normally carry 3 1/2 million fares on a business day.

A mass meeting of members of the CIO Transport Workers Union yesterday turned down Mayor Vincent R. Impellitteri's proposal for settling the wage-hour dispute.

Allan S. Haywood, executive vice president of the CIO, told the

meeting that the mayor had a duty to call a conference to speed negotiation of the strike issues.

The mayor, taking note of this remark, arranged the series of meetings today between representatives of the TWU and truck firms.

The strike of 8,200 drivers and maintenance men employed by the eight companies has halted 350 buses.

The mayor proposed Saturday that the men go on a 40-hour week March 1, with increases of 18 to 20 cents an hour in basic wages.

Giles Kin Is Found Dead In Dallas Hotel

DALLAS, Jan. 5 (AP)—Campbell Battle Giles, 77, an uncle of Texas Land Commissioner Bascom Giles, was found dead in a hotel room here yesterday.

He had registered into the hotel on New Year's day. The body was discovered when a maid went to the hotel manager and said she could not get into the room.

Death was believed to have been from natural cause but Justice of the Peace Glenn Byrd withheld an inquest verdict until he received a police report.

H-Bomb Reported Twice As Powerful As U.S. Atom Bomb

CHICAGO (AP)—The editor of an authoritative publication concludes that the United States has a hydrogen bomb more than twice as powerful as the atomic bomb.

Dr. Eugene Rabinowitch, editor of the Bulletin of Atomic Scientists, bases his opinion on Defense Department announcements and Atomic Energy Commission and eyewitness reports on test explosions on Eniwetok Atoll last November.

In an article he wrote for the monthly publication, Dr. Rabinowitch said Sunday the U. S. may have exploded its first H-bomb material at Eniwetok 20 months ago. The November explosion, vividly described in newspaper accounts by eyewitnesses, he concluded, "must have been" a follow-up experiment in which the amount of H-bomb material was increased.

The Atomic Energy Commission has described both tests as "including experiments contributing to thermonuclear research."
