

There will be one major change, however, that will affect all hospital patients. experience in radio preaching, These physicians will be charging directly to the patient or the patient's insurance policy for service. The cost for this service has been a part of the total x-ray fee in the past, but will not be after July 1, 1975. Hospital charges will be reduced to reflect this change at that time. Upon entering the hospital or occasionally for some clinic tests, patients will be asked to sign insurance forms specifically for the radiologists' fees if x-rays are ordered. If there

is no insurance, the radiologists, fee will be billed directly to the patient by the radiologists' office. This new procedure may be a bit confusing at first, but should help in the treatment of patients and, hopefully, get them well and back at home sooner.


