

Her health is still good and her memory is wonderful, and she likes to talk about the old times, and remembers playing with some of the neighbor's children when they lived near Oologah and Claremore, Oklahoma, some of which included the late Will Rogers family. She lives on and has her own little Cattle Ranch near Gorman, which she manages and personaly looks after the cows and calves as well as a registered Bull.

In the Year of 1900, her parents moved from Oologah to Tulsa, Oklahoma, where they operated a rooming and boarding house, where she met and married her late husband, Earl. L. Stone, Sr., March 10, 1910. To this union three children were born, whom all still survive: Mrs. Check Smith (Clara Mae) of Gorman, Mrs. H. J. Townsend (Minola) of Fort Worth, and Earl L. Stone, Jr. of Granbury, Texas.

Jennie came to Texas, (Desdemona) during the Oil Boon of 1918 and 1919 with her late husband Earl and settled in the Desdemona and Gorman area, and has been a resident of the area ever since, all her children are graduates of Gorman High School. Her late husband's Company, the Kennedy and Stone Drilling Co., drilled in one of the largest Oil Wells in the Desdemona Field, which was the Lewis Well No. 1,\_ during the Boom Days.




