





The state spent a total of \$7,548,647 last year for major welfare programs in Eastland County, according to Barbara Evans, Regional Administrator for the Texas Department of Human Services.

Food stamps worth \$1,356,650 were issued for the fiscal year which ended August 31, while Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) totaled \$225,674. Food stamps are funded entirely by the federal government, while the department determines eligibility of potential clients and nonclients and issues the Lone Star Card.


The state and federal governments share in the cost of TANF to families where needy children are deprived of support because of the absence or disability of one or both parents.

Nursing home costs of approximately \$4,562,233 were paid for aged and disabled residents. Community Care for Aged and Disabled spent \$1,200,126 for Medicaid related services and \$202,964 for non-Medicaid related services," Ms. Evans said.
