planting date for insured corn in Eastland County Ardell M. Kalmbach, Director for the Distric
09 of the Federal Crop In surance Corporatio
(FCIC). "Acres of cor planted by April 30 , in-
sured by FCIC (or by a private company rein
sured by FCIC reported by May 15 to
receive full crop in surance coverage," say Kalmbach.
Acreage planted after Acreage planted after
April 30 must also be reported acreage report as bein
planted too late for in "Farmers unable to plant prior to April 30
because of excess moisture conditions may
sign a 20 -day late planting agreement, which permit insurance coverage, but
provides for a lowe bushel-per-acre
guarantee due to the late planting, Kalmbach ex-
plained.
Farmers wishing additional information abou agreement should contac
thier local, authorize thier local, authorize
crop insurance agent.
