Gayle Mahan of De Leon was buried this week. We send out our sincere sympathy to all these families.

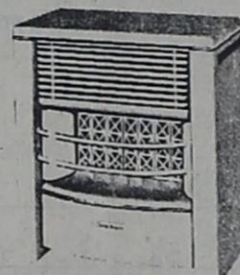

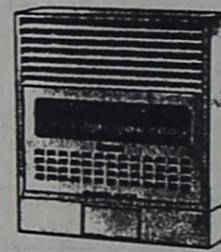

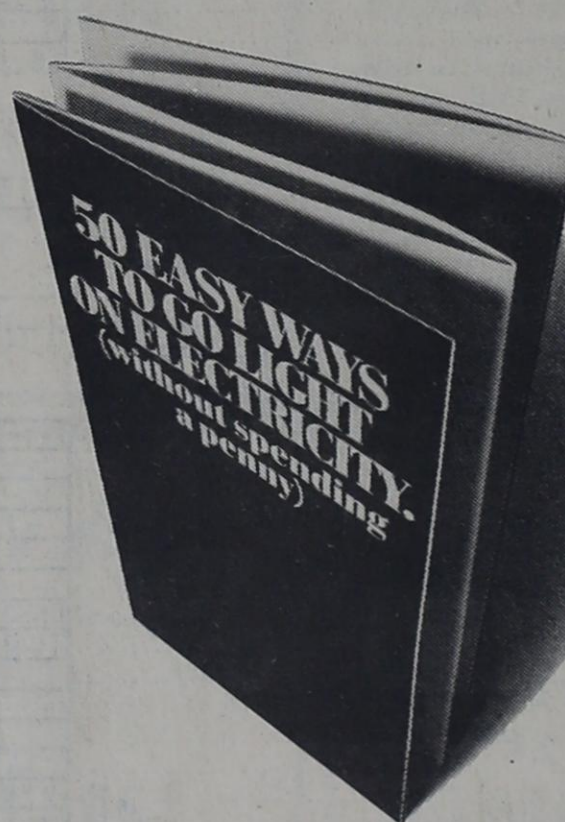
