The Board of Trustees for the Gorman Independent School District, Gorman, Texas, will accept sealed proposals for the design and construction of a one-story ten-classroom building to be performed under a PERFORMANCE CONTRACT.

Bids will be accepted at the Superintendent's office until 4:00 P.M. Friday, May 24, 1985, and addressed to the above. All proposals will be publicly opened, Tuesday May 28, 1985, at 8:00 p.m. in Superintendent's office, tabulated and taken under advisement by the Board for evaluation. The Board will have up to thirty days for evaluation and will award the contract at a called meeting or as directed by the Board. Bids may not be withdrawn or modified after time set for receipts of bids.

The classroom building program, setting forth the requirements schematic plans, outline specifications, instructions to bidders, and contract documents, may be obtained from Superintendent's office, Gorman, Texas, Area Code (817) 734-2614, or from Lee Stuart and Associates, architects, Post Office Box 15580, Fort Worth, Texas, or 1150 E Mansfield Hwy., Kennedale Texas, 817-478-1497, upon deposit of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) made payable to the architect. Deposit will be refunded in full if all documents are returned, in good condition, within ten days following receipt of bids. Plans will be available.

A cashier's check or certified check on a State or National Bank in the state of Texas, payable without recourse to the Gorman Independent School District, or acceptable Surety Proposal Bond, in an amount not less than five percent of the largest possible bid, including consideration of alternates, must accompany each bid as a guarantee that, if awarded the contract, the bidder will promptly enter into a contract and execute bonds on forms provided as outlines in the Specifications and Instructions to Bidders. A Performance Bond and Payment Bond in the amount of one-hundred percent (100%) of the contract price will be required.

The work will be awarded under a single prime contract, and including general construction, HVAC, plumbing, and electrical work. Attention is called to the fact that not less than the prevailing wage rates for the neighboring area to be paid on this

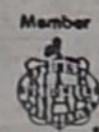
