



No one was present on Citizens In-Put.



Pause To Think

Let's take another look at what Paul had to say in 1 Corinthians 2:9-14. But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God. Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual. But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually dis-

It is extremely important that we become interested in the things that God wants to freely give us, and to understand that they cannot be discerned by natural senses or elements. Paul declares that no eye has ever seen them, and that no ear has ever heard. Also, no one has ever imagined in his/her heart the things that God has prepared for those who love him. God is not limited to what we have seen, heard, or imagined. However, our natural senses are very limited, especially when it comes to realizing the depth of spiritual gain/growth that each of us could ob-

It is important for us to understand clearly that we will never acquire those things that God desires to freely give us as long as long as we walk after the flesh. The scriptures also say that we will never discern them with the flesh. The things of God are spiritually discerned. Paul also stated, that they are taught or revealed to us by the Holy Ghost. Therefore it is extremely important that we receive the Holy Ghost/Spirt into our lives. When we are filled with His Spirit, it enables us to transcend the limitations of our flesh.

I have been amazed this past week at the ability of Russian scientist, cosmonauts, and others who may have assisted with the destruction of the Mir Space Station. These men and women were able through natural perception to harness the natural resources that God set in order, to build and maintain the Mir for several years. However, the Mir's final descent was truly amazing. Think with me how much time, effort, and learning preceded the Russian Space program's ability to remotely fire Mir's rockets thus launching the Mir into a trajectory of destination over the Fiji Islands and into a remote portion of the Ocean. They were able to do this because of their natural commitment to the study of God's natural resources until they were able to harness and use them constructively

If we think for one moment that God put more effort into the provision of natural resources than he did the spiritual, we are wrong. The Bible plainly states that in the last days, men would obtain a form of godliness, but deny the power thereof: II Timothy 3:5. It is high time that we who profess Christianity remove the parameters that we have placed on God and let Him work in and through our lives, as He desires to do. There may be those who would say that we can't put parameters on God, and that is a true statement with regard to his sovereignty. However, with regard to God's ability to work the fulness of His plan in our lives, we can most certainly limit Him with what we choose to believe and what we choose to deny. Look at Matthew 13:54-58.

FSA--Approved Texas Counties Accepting Livestock Assistance Program Applications

Eastland, Texas-March 20, 2000

The Eastland County Farm Service Agency is now accepting applications for the Livestock Assistance Program (LAP). According to David W. Martin, County Executive Director, LAP regulations were published as a final rule on March 19, 2001 and sign-up will end on April 27, 2001. LAP provides direct payments to producers who suffered grazing losses due to natural disaster during calendar year 2000.

"Often, producers equate Farm Service Agency assistance with row crops. However, LAP is one of the many livestock oriented programs available to producers through FSA," said Martin. "We recognize that individuals who raise livestock only, and those who raise livestock in conjunction with row crops have suffered devastating losses on both accounts due to recent natural disasters," he said.

According to Martin, 2001 LAP payments are available to qualifying counties. In Texas, 240 counties have been approved for LAP, including Eastland County. Eligible counties must have sustained a 40 percent or greater loss of available grazing for at least three consecutive months. Losses may have resulted from drought, excessive heat, disease, insect infestation and other adverse impacts attributed to a natural disaster event.

"LAP provides assistance to eligible livestock producers who have owned or leased qualifying livestock for at least three months prior to the payment period," said Martin. "Producers interested in LAP should be prepared to provide information including the number and kind of livestock, acres, location and type of grass forage used to support livestock, and an estimated percent of grazing loss."

Eligible livestock under LAP provisions are beef and dairy cattle, buffalo and beefalo when maintained on the same basis as beef cattle, sheep, goats, swine and equine animals used commercially for human food or kept for the production of food or fiber on the owner's farm.

The Secretary of Agriculture is authorized to provide approximately \$430 million in LAP assistance by the Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2001, Pub. L. 105-277.


