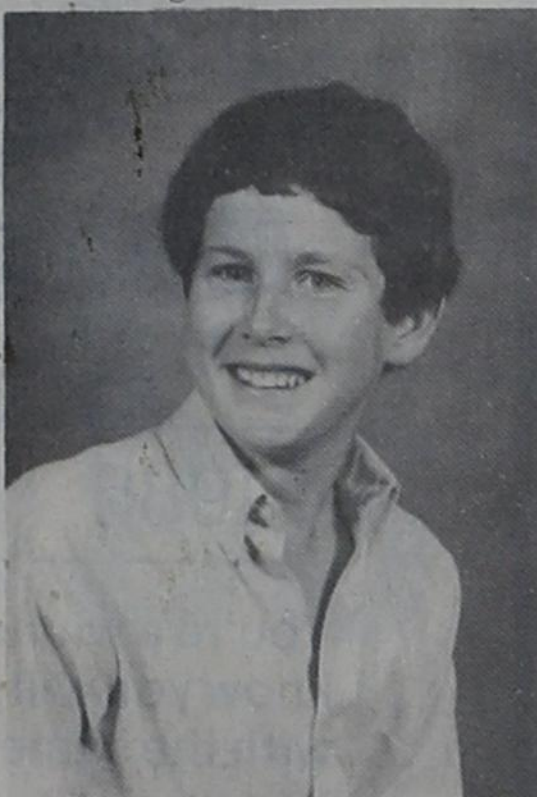

April enjoys sports, working in her garden, and playing the piano.

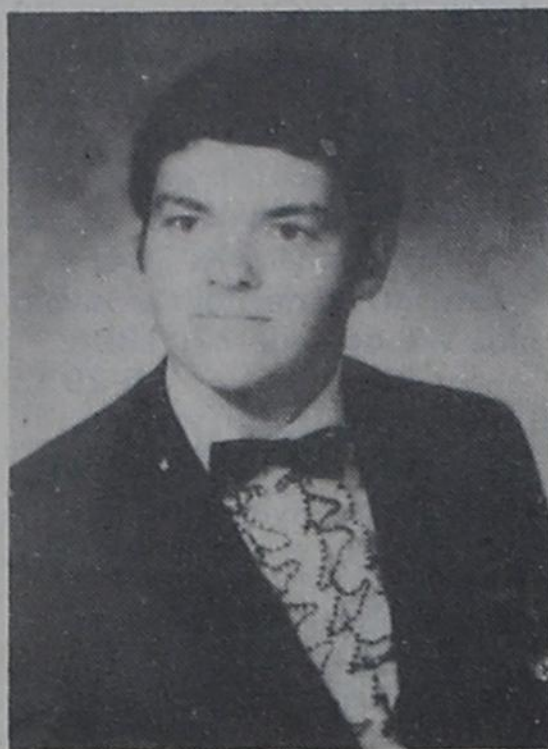


**THIRD RANKING
