GILASGOW DISUUSSES HB595 AND HB9O8 During the Regular Session of the
70 th Legislature, SB 595 and HB 908
were enacted concerning private
commercial carriers. SB 595 requires commercial carriers. SB 595 requires
all private commercial carriers (mot-
or vehicles) as defined by the or vehicles) as defined by the
Railroad Commission of Texas to be
registered with the Railroad Comregistered with the Railroad Com-
mission. HB 908 requires all private commercial carriers to file proof of
insurance with the Commission. insurance with the Commission.
There has been a great deal of
confusion as to the implementation confusion as to the implementation
of these bills, and I would like to
take this opportunity to discuss them take this opportunity to discuss them
with the people of my Senatorial
District District 22.
In August, the Railroad Commis
sion adopted a rule defining a sion adopted a rule defining a
commercial vehicle under $S B 559$ as
a vehicle weighing over 10,000
pounds used in furtherance of a
commercial enterprise. This defini-
tion considers the trailers or towed tion considers the trailers or towed
vehicle in calculating the weight of
the vehicle. At the same time, the
Commission adopted a rule pursuant to HB HB 908 which set minimum
liability insurance levels for these vehicles at that same level required
of for-hire motor carriers, I.E. $\mathbf{S 5 0 0}$, ooo combined single limit coverage.
Subsequently, the Railroad Commission published a rule change in empt from the definition of a
commercial vehicle, vehicles operatcommercial vehicle, vehicles operat-
ed by or on behalf of farmers and
ranchers in the conduct of their farm ranchers in the conduct of their farm
or ranch operations. Additionaly,
the Commission also published a the Commission also published a
rule that would lower the minimum insurance levels to that required by
the Safety-Responsibility Act for vehicles having three axles or less or
weighing under 26,000 pounds. Only weighing under 26,000 pounds. Only
vehicles larger than that or having
more than three axles would be more than three axles would
subject to the 5500,000 insurance The Railroad Commission, how-
ever, has neither proposed nor adopted regulations regarding safety
to be applied to group other than to be applied to group other than
for--ike motor carriers.
The Texas Dept. of Public Safety The Texas Dept. of Public Safety
has proposed regulations pursuant to
HB 908 that are similar to those of the United States Dept. of Transpor-
tation to be applied to for-hire and
private motor carriers alike. These regulations require that commercial
vehicle operators observe hours of
service, maintain drivers logs, and service, maintain drivers logs, and
take physical examinations, among
other requirements. These are the requirements that would apply to
private carriers such as delivery trucks, beer trucks and other private
vehicles not for-hire.
