Gorman High School Students Complete Senate Scholars Program



AUSTIN — Gorman High School junior Keith Treadway and senior Mark Glover on Thursday visited the Texas Capitol to participate in the Senate Scholars Program conducted by state Sen. David Sibley, R-Waco.

The Senate Scholars Program gives Texas Senate District 22 high school juniors and seniors a firsthand look at the operation of state government. This is the fourth legislative session that Sibley has hosted the students.

Treadway and Glover served as pages on the floor of the Texas Senate, observed a Senate committee hearing and toured the Capitol during their trip to Austin.

"Hopefully a day at the Capitol brought to life lessons the students have learned in their civics and government classes," Sibley said. "I've been very impressed with the students who have been chosen for the Senate Scholars Program."

Students from 86 high schools in Sibley's senatorial district were invited to participate in the Senate Scholars Program.

Registration for Credit by Exam

Gorman ISD students needing to register for Credit by Exam have until June 14, 2001 to sign up for these tests. To be eligible to earn credit by examination, a student can have received no prior instruction in the academic subject and must score 90 percent or above on a criterion-referenced examination for accreditation for the applicable course.

At the time of registration, the student will be required to make a \$20.00 deposit for each test they register to take. The student will need to check with the building principal before completing the registration. Registration for Credit by Examination will take place in the High School office.

Testing dates will be the week of July 23rd through 27th. The cost of exams will be \$28.00.
