Dear Parent or Guardian:
The Gorman School serves nutritious meals every day. Students may buy
lunch for $95 \& \$ 1.00$ and breakfast lunch for $95 \& \$ 1.00$ and breakfast for holds that meet Federal Income guidelines are eligible for free meals or reduced-price meals at .40 for lunch and .30 for breakfast. To apply for free or reduced-price meals,
complete the enclosed application, sign it and return it to the school.
FOOD STAMP/AFDC HOUSE HOLDS:If you currently recieve Food Stamps or "Aid to Families with Depeendent Children" for your child you only have to list your child's
name and food stamp or AFDC case number, print your name, and sign the application. Since you have already given income information to the welfare office, the school can
confirm your eligibility onfirm your eligibility.
ALL OTHER HOUSEHOLDS: If your household income is at or below the level shown on the enclosed scale,
your child is eligible for either free or your child is eligible for either free or
reduced-price meals. To apply for reduced-price meals. To apply for
meal benefits, you must provide the following information and sign the application: (1) children, other relatives and unrelated people who live
in your household, (2) list the social in your household, (2) list the social
security number of each adult age 21 or older. If an adult does not have a social security number print "None" (3) list a total monthly income and

ductions for taxes, social security etc.) each person recieved last month and where it is from, such as wages, retirement, or welfare. If you have a household member for whom last
month's income was higher or lower thah usual, list the person's expected average monthly income.
VERIFICATION:The information on school officials at any time during the school year.

REPORTING CHANGES:If you list income information and your child
is approved for meal benefits, you must tell the school when your
household income increses by 550 or more per month ( $\mathbf{~} 600$ per year) when your household size decreases If you list a food stamp case numbe of AFDC number, you must tell the school when you no longer recieve
food stamps or AFDC for your child. FOSTER CHILD. Your foster child may be eligible for meal benefits. If you wish to apply for meal benefits or a foster child, contact the school or help with the application. NONDISCRIMINATION: Chlldren who recieve free or reduced-price
