proceeds from Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans as income in the year the loan proceeds are received, ac-
cording to the Internal Revenue Servcordin
Normally, income from a crop is reported in the year the crop is sold
However, if part or all of a farmer's However, if part or all of a farmer's
production is pledged to secure a CCC production is pledged to secure a CCC
loan, the farmer can choose to repor the loan proceeds as income in the year the loan proceeds are received rather than in the year the crop is sold. This
may be to the farmer's advantage be cause it more closely matches crop in come with the expenses to produce the crop and is an easier accounting
method. from the Internal Revenue Service to adopt this method of reporting CCC reported CCC loans in earlier years as taxable income in the year the crop was sold. However, once you have reported a CCC loan as income in the year loans in the same way, unless you obtain permission from IRS to change to a different method.
ceeds as income CCC loan proreport becomes your cost basis in the commodity. When you sell the commodity, you only have to report as in-
come at the time of salc the the loan forgiveness or sale proceed that are greater than your basis in the commodity. The commodity is sold repaying the loan or CCC in lieu of he loan and sell the commodity to another party. For example, suppose
hat you reported a $\$ 10,000$ CCC as income in 1986. In 1987, the market price for corn is higher than the loan value (support price) and so you
redeem the loan for $\$ 10,000$ plus inerest and storage costs of $\$ 950$. If the orn is sold for $\$ 12,000$, you have a
gain of $\$ 2,000$ ( $\$ 12,000$ minus $\$ 10,000)$. Also, you would have in-
terest and storage costs of $\$ 950$ to deduct in the year paid.

Heavy Vehicle Use Tax: Exemption for Some Farm Trucks

According to the Internal Revenue
Service, liability for the federal heavy vehicle use tax may be suspended for an agricultural vehicle under certain
ircumstances. The tax may be suspended during a tax period if it is reasonable to expect that during the period an otherwise taxable highway
motor vehicle used for agricultural motor vehicle used for agriculurara
purposes will be used on public iles or less for non-agricultural vehicles).
An agricultural vehicle is any highway motor vehicle that is:

- Used, or expected to be used, primarily for farming purposes, and - Registered as a highway motor vehicle used for farming purposes under cle is required to be registered. A highway motor vehicle is used primarily for farming purposes if more than half of the vehicle's use, based on
mileage, during the tax period is for farming purposes.
To qualify for the suspension of tax, the owner of the vehicle must complete a statement in support of the suspen-
sion of tax on the first Form 2290, Heavy Vehicle Use Tax Return, filed for the period. If, while the tax is
suspended, the vehicle is used on public highways for more than 7,500 miles during the period, the owner period or part of the period for which exceeded the 7,500 mile total. The lax is reported on a Form 2290 filed by the last day of the month immediately following the month in which the vehiIf an agricultural vehicle on which use tax already has been paid for the ax period is used less than 7,500 miles on public highways, the owner may
claim credit for the tax on the first
