



## **Gorman Students TEAMS Test Results Are Good**

Results of the 1989 TEAMS test Reading, 95, 92 and 88; Writing, were given at the June meeting of the Gorman ISD Board of truetees. The Texas Assessment of Basic Skills was given to students in grades 1-3-5-7-9 and 11 and to those 12th grade students who did not show mastery on the test earlier. Scored reported were good with most objectives showing a high percentage of mastery.

Only in seventh-grade writing did Gorman students fall below statewide averages of students exhibiting




