

### **Press Points** Joe Bennett, Publisher

The weatherman isn't cooperating with folks in our area as we are needing some rain very badly and so far there has been none lately. The peanuts are sure needing rain at this time and it is critical that they get moisture. Maybe the rain will be here soon, and we hope it's "very soon".

Some folks from here attended the meeting of the County Commissioners meeting on Monday and were on hand to see the commissioners vote to go ahead with the financing for the purchase of land for the proposed state prison, if the Eastland County site is approved by the state. The opposition to the project was at the meeting and expressed their views against the commissioners purchasing the land. The group was notified that there would be 14 days from the publication of the notice to finance for the land purchase for the opposition to petition the court for a vote on the proposition, and that there would have to be 5 percent of the "qualified voters" of Eastland County singing the petition before it would be accepted by the court. The opposition immediately began gathering signatures on a petition outside the court chambers, even though no legal statement for the notice of publication on the issue had been released at the time.

Folks should be aware of exactly what they are signing before they affix their signature to a petition. This petition, if signed by enough eligible voters, could possibly cause problems for our county in securing this much needed boost to our economy, and the economy of the surrounding area. So if you agree that Eastland County should have this prison and the economic boost that could help save our county from economic disaster, you should NOT sign the petition, no matter what other information you are told to the contrary. Wouldn't it be tragic if a small number of people opposing this project could cause the majority of folks in our county to be denied the privilege of securing this most important facility for our area.

So folks be very aware of what you are signing before you put your name on anything.

The Eastland County Economic evelopment Council continues to be 'very optimistic" for our chances to be approved as a location of one of the prison units. The council is hopeful that the attempt by the opposition to secure enough names will fail as no election is really necessary and that the Commissioners Court and the council can continue to do the things required to secure this prison unit for our county.

The Panthers continues got back in the win column again on Friday night by defeating Santo by a 42-6 margin. The Panthers did a very good job, both defensively and offensively, to get in the win column.

This week Gorman will host Santa Anna at 8 p. m. at Brogdon Field in another Class A clash between two good teams and it should be a real fine ball game to watch. So come on out and support the Big Red and help them get yet another victory.

# PANTHERS DROP WILDCATS 42-6; HOST SANTA ANNA FRIDAY NIGHT

The Gorman Panthers evened their season record to two wins and two losses on Friday night as they hosted the Santo Wildcats in their first home game of the season and really thrilled the hometown Panther fans by overwhelming the Wildcats

The Panthers kicked off to Santo and held them. Then took the punt on their own 40 and scored in 8 plays with Brandon Gilmore getting the final 4 yards on a run with 5:36 left in the period. The drive featured a 32 and 11 yard run respectively for Robby Hand before Gilmore's run. Kevin Hirst kicked the point after.

On the next Santo possession the Big Red defense got a Wildcat fumble on the Santo 33 and scored in 4 plays with Gilmore again getting the scoring honors on a 9 yard run with 3:46 left. The drive also featured a 12 yard run by Hirst and a Santo penalty also helped. Hirst kicked the PAT and Gorman led 14-0.

Then on the next possession the Wildcats took the ball on their own 34 and started a drive. The first play netted 20 yards, then the next gained 4 before the Big Red defense was shocked by Santo when L. D. CRawford broke loose off the outside and raced 45 yards for the score with 2:24 left in the first period. The kick for point after was blocked and the score was 14-6.

But from that point on the Panthers took control of the game. On the next possession the Panthers got the ball on the Santo 40 and scored in 8 plays with Kevin Hirst running it in from 7 yards out with 11:23 left in the second. The drive featured a 9 yard run by Gilmore for a first; and then a 12 yard play, before Hirst passed to Jason Ditmore for 13 yards and a first down at the Santo 15. Following runs of 6 and 2 yards, Hirst hit paydirt. Hirst added the PAT and the score was 21-6.

From there the substitutes took over and went the rest of the way.

Gilmore led the Gorman ball carriers with 127 yards on 12 carries. Browning had a good night with 74 yards on 6 tries. Robby Hand did good with 75 yards on 10 trips. Hirst had 56 on 6 keepers. Jason Ditmore had 31 on 7 tries. Churck Fonville got 8 on 6 trips. Rajee Patel had a minus 2 on 3 carries.

The Big Red defense did a very good job on the Wildcats most of the night, allowing only a couple of big runs, one of which was the touchdown scamper.

The Big Red defense will be tested again this Friday night as they host the Santa Anna Mountaineers in another Class A struggle at Brogdon Field at 8 p. m. Santa Anna has also had tough sledding so far but have a very good team and the Panthers will have to be ready for this one.


