#### **Central Texas Peanut Shortcourse** To Address Grower Challenges in 2001

Possible assessments, insurance changes, higher input costs, opening up the farm bill--all of these and more challenges peanut growers in the Cross Timbers area of Texas face. It is these challenges to peanut production that will be addressed at a multicounty Peanut Shortcourse to be held Tuesday, February 20. Growers from throughout the Cross Timbers including Erath, Comanche and Eastland counties along with the scattered growers in Brown and Callahan counties will joint together as a group to address grower concerns and issues. The Central Texas Peanut Shortcourse will be held at the DeLeon City Auditorium on Hwy. 16 in DeLeon. The program will start at 8:00 a.m. with registration and then get underway at 8:30 a.m. There is no cost attend but participants are asked to preregister by calling their ocal Extension office or 915/356-2539. A sponsored lunch will be served and 1.5 pesticide credits, one-half in IPM and one in General, will be offered to private non-commercial and commercial applicators.

Individuals with disabilities who require an auxiliary aid, service or accommodation in order to participate in this program are encouraged to contact the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in Comanche County at 915/356-2539 to determine how reasonable accommodations can be made.

The Peanut Shortcourse will start with an update on peanut programs and Farm Service Agency procedures from David Martin with the farm Service Agency in Eastland County. David is well known for his expertise in peanut programs and he will be an excellent resource for growers as they make plans for quota in

Following Mr. Martin will be Gary Johnson with the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation in Kansas City. Gary will address the guidelines for the Federal Crop Insurance program and any changes for 2001. Gary will also discuss the disaster provisions

for peanuts and how it affects insurance payments in the future. Peanut insurance has played an increasing role in peanut production as farm programs shift to a reliance insurance payments during disaster. To discuss Federal Crop Insurance Risk Management, Sam Cameron with FCIC out of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma will again be on the program. Sam's presentation was an interesting part of the program in 2000 and his presentation will be very informative as producers make insurance plans for 2001.

Also on the program to discuss the economics of crop insurance will be Dr. Ken Stokes. Dr. Stokes is the Extension Economist, Texas A&M University-Stephenville and is known by producers for his help with crop decision aids.

Following Ken will be Dan Hunter with Southwestern Peanut Growers Association. There is tremendous concern among growers about the peanut loan, buybacks and grower assessments. Dan will give growers a "Peanut Program Update" and discuss how the program is working for growers and parts that need repair to help growers in the future.

Dr. Chip Lee and Dr. Robert Lemon both are known across the state to peanut growers. Dr. Lee will bring an update on fungiides growers can use in 2001 including some new changes and r. Robert Lemon will talk about the peanut varieties to use including how they perform and under less than ideal conditions.

Dr. Charles Simpson, Peanut Breeder, Texas A&M University has some outstanding results in his breeding program for nematode resistance. Dr. Simpson will present data on variety performance and the future of nematode resistance.

We are currently working on his family tree (the Willis Scott Family) and know that some relatives lived in the Gorman/Duster area about twenty years ago.

Once we arrived in Gorman we found that the address we had was no longer in existence. We drove around for a little bit before we stopped at a grocer store located on Kent just up from the police department. The clerks in the store tried to help us, as did several customers. I believe it was the manager or owner who referred us to the police department.

We paid a visit to the police department and found Sgt. Saldana more than helpful. He tried to think of any persons that had been around Gorman for a while and made several phone calls on our behalf. After not being able to reach anyone by phone, he sent us to see Irene West who resides at the local Housing Authority hoping that she might be able to help us.

We stopped at Irene's but her neighbor informed us that she was out of town for the day. The neighbor (I did not get this lady's name) took us down the hall to talk to another neighbor. This neighbor was unfamiliar with the name of the person we were looking for but made a couple of phone calls on our behalf. No luck. That is when the first neighbor suggested we go talk to Opal Burton. She gave us Opal's phone number and address and sent us on our way.

We found Opal's home and she welcomed us inside, the same as everyone had in your friendly town. Opal was able to refer us to a distant cousin (Bob Huddleston of DeLeon) and contact was finally made. We had been searching for any member of this family for two years.

We came to Gorman hoping we would be able to find a relative. We had no idea we would receive the kind of help we encountered once we got there. You should be proud of the citizenry of your town. You have to understand that we relocated six months ago from California to Texas. Had we needed to locate someone in California, I doubt it would have gone as well.
