





In your column last week you talked about Eastland County voting to have there own ambulance service. In the article, you wrote of April 27th you said that Ranger and Rising Star have volunteer ambulance services. However, Rising Star is the only volunteer ambulance service in the county. Ranger ambulance is a paid service based out of the hospital with paid personnel running the service.

When the county and cities started planning for an ambulance service, they were more concerned with Eastland and Cisco than they were over Gorman, Ranger, or Rising Star, because Rising Star and Ranger have an ambulance service, while Gorman still does not have one, even after the county agreed to fund a service. If the citizens of Gorman are going to have to pay for Eastland and Cisco to have an ambulance, that is mainly going to serve these two cities. The tax money from Gorman should go toward an ambulance service for Gorman, who still does not have a service even after the county voted for one. Why should Gorman "foot the bill" for a service that is mainly going to serve the people of Eastland and Cisco.

Also a Garage Sale will be held the same day from 9 a. m. to 6 p. m.



DISABILITY PAYMENTS QUALIFY FOR MONTHLY

Persons unable to work due to AIDS-Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome - or other illnesses caused by HIV infection, may qualify for monthly disability payments under Social Security or supplemental security income (SSI), Glyn Hammons, Social Security manager in Abilene, said recently.

Social Security pays disability benefits to workers who suffer a physical or mental impairment which is expected to keep them from working a year or more or to result in death. Applicants who have documented AIDS, are not working, and meet the non-disability requirements for Social Security coverage, generally qualify under this definition, Hammons said.

He also noted that other people infected with the human immunodefeicency virus (HIV) that causes AIDS and whose condition prevents them from working may also qualify for disability payments. Commonly called "Aids Related Complex" or "ARC", the condition is diagnosed

from symptoms generally associated with the AIDS virus, but is not fully developed AIDS.

"ARC cases are evaluated on a case-by-case basis," Hammons said. "If the person's condition is so severe that he or she is unable to work, benefits are generally payable."

Generally, there is a waiting period of 5 months from the onset of the disability before Social Security disability benefits can start. However, there is no waiting period under SSI, a program which Social Security also administers, and which makes monthly disability payments to disabled or blind persons with limited income amd resources. In addition, a "presumptive" disability decision may be made if it is highly probable that the person's condition is disabling. Presumptive SSI disability payments may be made for up to 3 months.

SSI payments are made from Federal general revenues, not the Social Security trust funds. No prior work is required for SSI payments. Social Security disability beneficiaries with low benefits may also qualify for SSI if they meet the income and resource limitations.

"Because disability applications generally take longer to process than other kinds of Social Security claims, people who have been diagnosed with AIDS or ARC and are not working should apply for disability benefits immediately," Hammons said. They may start by calling the nearest Social Security office. The phone number in Abilene is 698-1360 and for those living outside Abilene, there is a toll free number 1-800-234-5772.
