

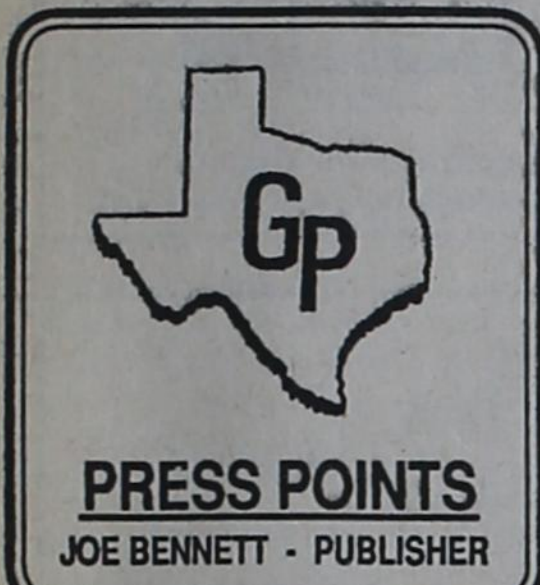

RUNOFF ELECTION SLATED FOR TUESDAY, APR. 10

There will be a runoff in the Eastland County races on the Democratic Party Ballot April 10th. The runoff race will be the 91st District Clerk's race, with Bill Mearns and Kathy Trout Hallum on the ballot.

Runoffs on the Democratic ballot for State offices include Ann Richards and Jim Mattox for Governor; Tom Bowden and Nikki Van Hightower for Treasurer; and two places to fill on the courts.

The Republican ticket will have no runoffs for county offices.

State candidates in the Republican Party Runoffs include Rick Perry and Richard McIver for Commissioner of Agriculture and Ews Golbert and Grady Yarbrough for Commissioner of the General Land Office.

Voters are reminded that they must vote in the same party's Runoff Election as they voted in the March 13th Primary Election.

Those who did not vote in the Primaries may choose whichever party they wish to vote in the April 10th Runoff election.

Polling places will be at the same locations as the March 13th primaries with polls opening at 7 a. m. and closing at 7 p. m.

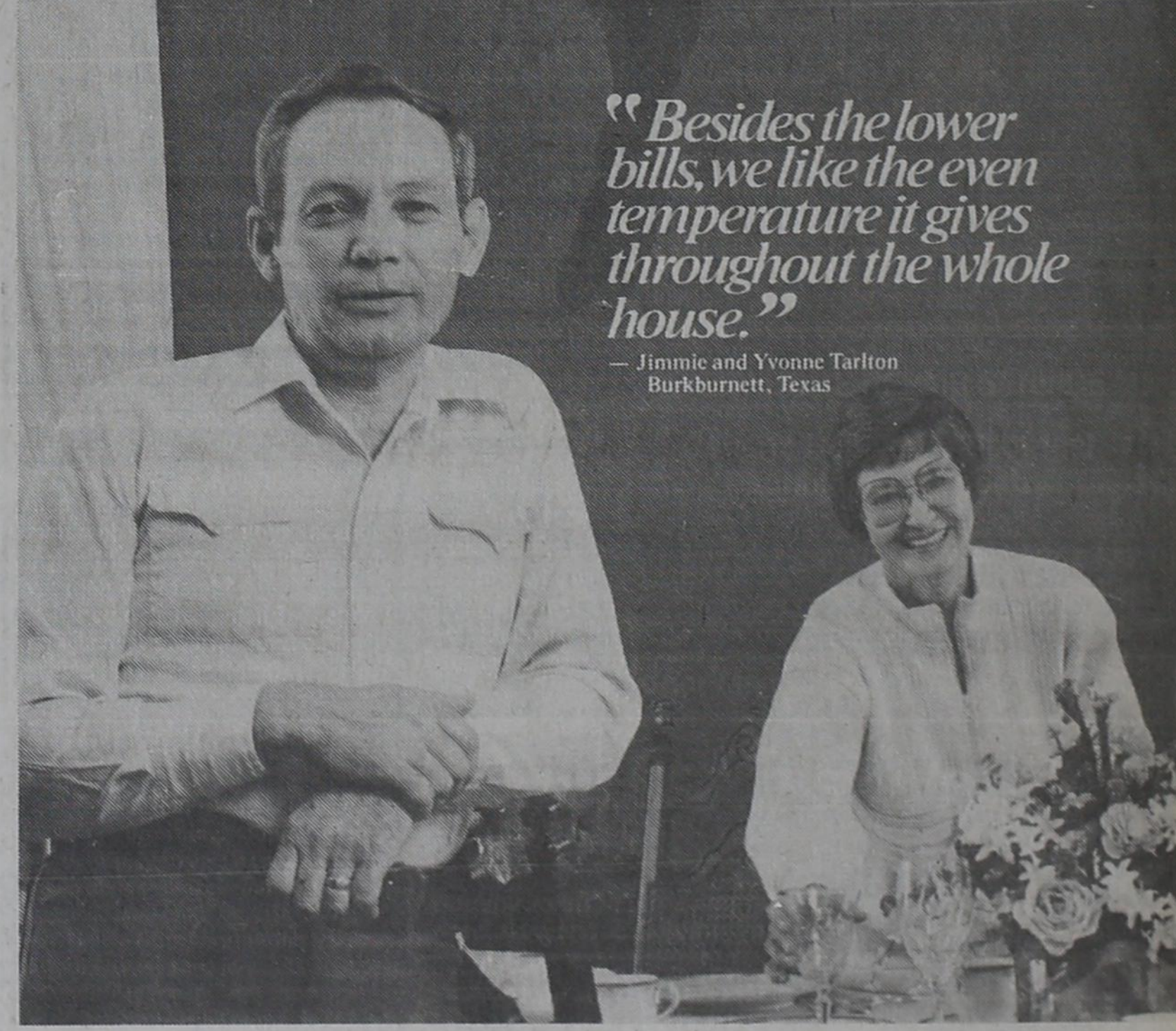

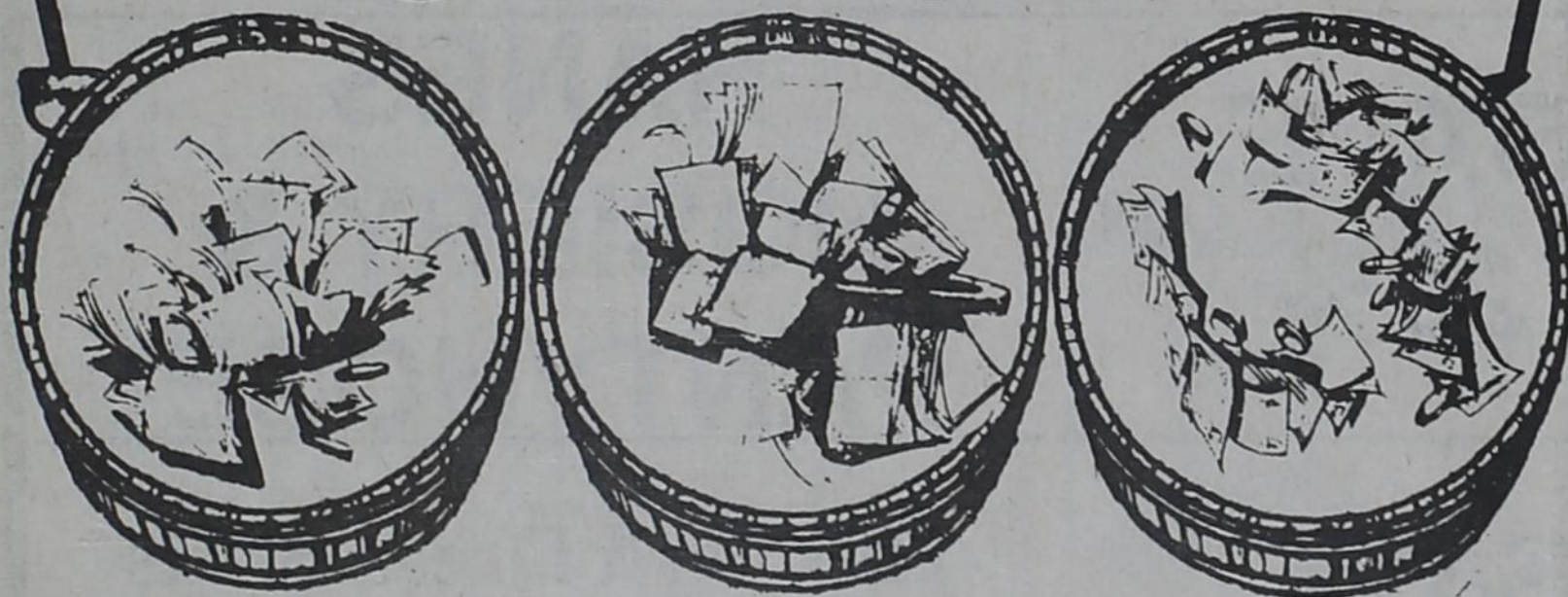
