producers who have to fight Sclerotinia blight and Southern Blight. The EPA has turned down the Section 18 label request for Botran for use on peanuts. As of press time, the EPA has not granted a Section 18 label
request for Tilt and it is questionable if they will approve the request. This means that both of these products
cannot be used on peanuts. cannot be used on peanuts. The only fully labeled product for
Sclerotinia Blight control is Sclerotinia Blight control is Rovral.
Chemicals labeled for control of Southern Blight are Vitavax or Terraclor (PCNB). Read and follow label instructions for rates and applications. Additional information
