## Gorman Cagers Defeat Santa Anna Teams

The Gorman High School Cage teams played Santa Anna on Friday and both came away with victories. The Lady Panthers won 40 to 37 and the Panthers won a thriller by a 35-33 margins.  
In the girls action the game was close with Santa Anna leading 6 to 5. But in the second quarter the Lady Panthers out scored Santa Anna for a 17-16 halftime lead. In the third quarter Santa Anna added 6 points while Gorman scored only 3. However, in the final period Gorman score 20 big points while holding Santa Anna to 15 for the win. Thomas led the Lady Panthers with 13 points. Goode and Sanchez each hit for 9. Rodriquez had 5. Guthery and Lobo each had 2. Gorman is now 8 and 14 on the season.

## Gorman Girls Power Lifting Team Competes

The Girls Powerlifting Team competed this past weekend in Mason. This was their second meet of the year and it showed. All of the girls had great improvement over the first competition. The girls and Boys competed in Hamilton. Christina Mauney - 320 squat, 135 bench, and 300 dead lift for a total of 755. This was 35 pounds better than the first meet.
