## NOTICE OF VOTE ON TAX RATE

The Gorman City Commission conducted a public hearing on a proposal to increase your property taxes by .0582 percent on September 3, 1992 at 6:00 p.m.

The Gorman City Commission is scheduled to vote on the tax rate at a public hearing to be held on September 17, 1992 at Gorman City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

## Notice of Comparable Tax Rates and Revenues

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provides $\$ 4,505$ per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides $\$ 4,960$ per student in state and local revenues.

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of $\$ .93444$ for country education districts. State law does not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require as school district to adopt a tax rate that miximizes the receipt of state funds.

The board of trustees of the Gorman School District hereby gives notice that it is considering the adoption of a tax rate of .28 that will provide $\$ 5,085$ per student in state and local revenues.
