NASA's John C. Stennis Space NASA's John C. Stennis Space
Center in Mississippi. The program, center in Mississippi. The program,
called NEWMAST (NASA Educational Workshop for Math, Science and Technology School teachers) is sponsored by NASA, the National
Science Teachers Associan Science Teachers Association, the
National Council of Teachers of Mathematics and the Association for Technology Education.
She was one of 24 teachers chosen from thousands of applicants from across the U. S. and from U. S. State Department Schools in Europe and
the Middle East. The Newmast program places t. The Newmast program places teachers in direct
contact with NASA's science and engineering professionals and those of other resident federal agencies at Stennis Space Center for the purpose of exposing them to current, state-of-
the-art the-art research in space science,
technology and the environment.

Highlights of the program this year included a static firing of a Space Shuttle Main Engine, tours of the Space Shuttle Main Engine test
complex at Stennis, the Michoud Assembly Facility in New Orleans where external tanks are manufactured and briefings by Nasa officials on topics ranging from astronomy to remote sensing of the Earth, NASA Aeronautics research and environ-
