THE GORMAN PROGRESS
North Texas High Panthers of
School Rodeo 1920-1921 of Anniston, Alabama
In going through a lot of papers after my wife passed away (after 65 ears), Ithought you might want to
fun this in your paper. My mother and dad are buried in
he Gorman Cemetery. My sister (he Gorman Cemetery. My sister
(Jo Fuller) worked in Gorman for I went to Gorman High School. I
many years. am now 88 years of age and was
married for 65 years (to the same woman).
I served in Granny Rush's class I served in Granny Rush's class
during my school years. Ed Layton during my school years. Ed Layto
was one of the principals. Thanks,

The Panthers of 1920 were football
pioneers for Gorman High School They were the first football team in
the history of Gorman. Most of the boys had never even seen a football, much less played the game. The
inexperienced team lost every game they played in 1920 .
The boys must have learned a lot
in that first season, however, for in in that first season, however, for in
1921 only 2 teams defeated them 1921 only 2 teams defeated them. The Panthers won 7 games that
season, and lost only to Brecken-
ridge and Cisco reason, and Cisco. Teams on the
ridgedule in ' 21 were Breckenridge. schedule in 21 were Breckenridge,
Hico, Eastland, Cisco, Dublin, Stephenville, De Leor, Rising Star and Ranger. There were 17 boys on the
leam and their jerseys were red and white. In '21, the Panthers had built $u_{p}$ such a good record that mighty
Breckenridge wanted to play them Breckenridge wanted to play them
Breckenridge payed Gorman $\$ 250$ to come to their city, but it cost about
$\$ 100$ for the S100 for the team in traveling expenses. The Panthers had played Dublin on Thursday, and had to play
Breckenridge on Saturday. So the Breckenridge on Saturday. So
boys just had one day of rest. But they were "men of iron" in those
days, and the boys were rarin' to go. The team started for Breckenridge
early Friday morning, and it took all early Friday morning, and it took all
day to get there. There were paved roads in those days, and th nud and dirt slowed the four cars to
crawl sometimes. Also cars were not as fast as they are now. But the boys finally got there and showed the
big city boys that they were no big city boys that they were no
"country hicks". The Panthers play "country hicks". The Panthers play-
ed the Buckaroos a close game, and Breckenridge barely won, $13-0$. Football fields in those days were
ust cow pastures, and the tracks left just cow pastures, and the tracks left
by the cattle made running a treacherous business. There were many sand burrs in the field, and during "time outs"" the boys would pick the
