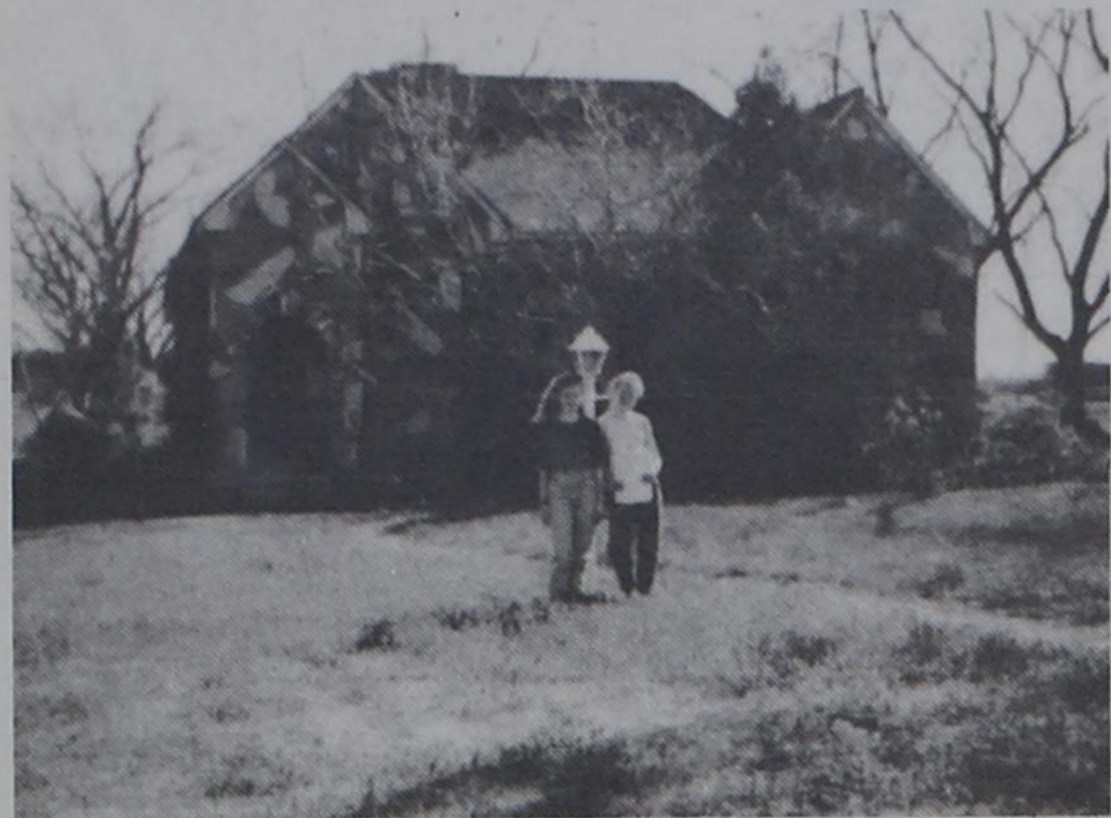

"The Home That Housed Many"



Who knew in 1882 that the house Mr. Bennett was building on a peach farm would last over one hundred and ten years? This house was already established before the town of Gorman was even thought of.

The next owner was a Lebanese man, Mr. E. A. Boaz. He, his wife, and one son came to Texas from Lebanon in 1937. They opened a dry goods store located where Foster Floral is today. Mr. Boaz added a cellar, storehouse, and rocked the house of six hundred dollars. If you look closely, you can see a rough textured Lebanese rock centered over the front archway. The rock was a memento from his homeland.

After Mr. Boaz left the house, a Ms. Ellen Oldham bought it. She was married to a Mr. Lesuer. He was the father of Joan Crawford. Some people actually recall Joan Crawford's appearance in Gorman.

Next, B. B. Brummett, moved into his house with his wife and daughter. He was superintendent of schools in the 1940's. While we was at Gorman, Brodgon Field was built.

S. S. Powers purchased the house and later sold it to Mr. Roberts.

Finally, in 1960 John and Ethel Sutton moved into the house. They are the current owners of the house on 332 Lexington Street. The Suttons have three sons: Edward, Mac, and Richard. The grandchildren of Mr. and Mrs. Sutton enjoy exploring all of the "secret passages" and "trap doors" that run throughout the house. Ethel would like for the house to eventually become a museum, so that the future generations of Gorman will know about their heritage.

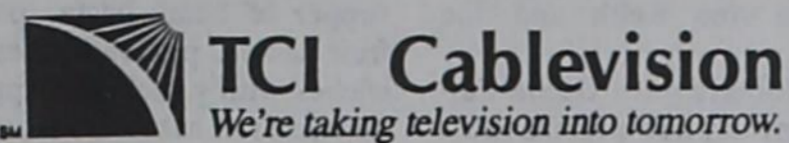

Petition Presented To County On Precinct #5 Abolishments

On March 8th Constable Dewey Keese and Justice of the Peace V. O. Huff presented a petition to the Commissioner's Court. The petition contained 190 signatures of the taxpaying voters, more than five percent of the qualified voters in Precinct 5. Precincts 1, 2, 3 and 4 Commissioners and County Clerk were present. Constable Keese and JP Huff told the Commissioners Court that if they wanted to abolish the office of Justice of the Peace and Constable of Precinct 5, they should put the matter on the ballot and let the voters have their say instead of denying the voters the right to vote on abolishment of their Justice of Peace and Constable Offices.

§ 81.021. Change in Precinct Boundaries (a) A commissioner court that orders a change in the boundaries of commissioner or justice precincts may specify in its order an effective date of the change that is not later than January 1 following the next general election. An election for precinct office occurring after the date that the order is issued but before the effective date of the change in boundaries shall be held in the precincts as they will exist on that effective date. A person who has resided in the area included in a new precinct for the period required for eligibility to hold office is not made ineligible on the ground that the precinct has not existed for that period. (b) The term of office of a commissioner, justice of the peace, or constable who holds office at the time a change in precinct boundaries becomes effective is not affected by the change, regardless of whether the change places the officer's residence outside the precinct for which the officer was elected. The officer is entitled to serve for the remainder of the term to which the officer was elected.


§ 271.049. Notice of Intention to Issue Certificates; Petition and Election (a) Regardless of the sources of payment of certificates, certificates may not be issued unless the issuer publishes notice of its intention to issue the certificates. The notice must be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper, as defined by Chapter 84, Acts of the 43rd Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1933 (Article 28a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), that is of general circulation in the area of the issuer, with the date of the first publication to be before the 14th day before the date tentatively set for the passage of the order or ordinance authorizing the issuance of the certificates. (b) The notice must state: (1) the time and place tentatively set for the passage of the order or ordinance authorizing the issuance of the certificates; (2) the maximum amount and purpose of the certificates to be authorized; and (3) the manner in which the certificates will be paid for, whether by taxes, revenues, or a combination of the two. (c) If before the date tentatively set for the authorization of the issuance of the certificates or if before the authorization, the municipal secretary or clerk if the issuer is a municipality, or the county clerk if the issuer is a county, receives a petition signed by at least five percent of the qualified voters of the issuer protesting the issuance of the certificates, the issuer may not authorize the issuance of the certificates unless the issuance is approved at an election ordered, held, and conducted in the manner provided for bond elections under Chapter 1, Title 22, Revised Statutes.

CITY OF DE LEON OFFERING SPACE FOR 911

City Coordinator Fred Turner met with the Comanche County Commissioners' Court last week and offered space by the City of De Leon to the county for the 911 emergency system.

The proposed area offered is the 3,000 square feet old legion hall on the city hall's second floor that is now being used for storage. This space is reported to be excess to the city's needs at the present time and probably would be in the future, also. It has a private outside entrance and its own restroom, but needs work.

Also, the City of De Leon is willing to work with the County to implement the system quickly.

At last Monday's Commissioners' Court meeting, there was discussion by the commissioners to file for Certificates of Obligation on various projects and free some budget money that could be used for 911 implementation. The County reportedly does not have the funds to do the 911 implementation at the present time. This process could take three to four months.

City officials in De Leon are offering

to enter into an agreement with the county commissioners and offer funds to renovate the old legion hall area to get it prepared for 911. Everything would be under the County's control and when the County's money is free, the loan would be repaid to the City. "In short, the City of De Leon was saying 'we'll make you, the citizens of the county, a short term interim loan in order to get this implemented quickly,'" says Turner.

Renting of the 3,000 square feet area has also been mentioned. Proposed by the City is the first year, and possibly longer, to be rent-free.

Turner points out that the 911 equipment is highly sophisticated and computerized and the 911 dispatchers are medically trained personnel. They're trained to handle emergencies on the phone, to get people to stay on the phone so that they can get all the needed information. With the required mapping of the city and county, the exact location of a phone call is displayed immediately.

With the central dispatch system, operators also have the capability of

dispatching police and ambulance units.

The 50 cents paid each month on phone bills has gone to the state's emergency fund, earmarked for 911 in this county. When 911 is given the go-ahead the state will install the necessary equipment. The 50 cents per month will continue to be charged, with those funds to go toward updating the system as needed.

The operation of 911 and central dispatch, says Turner, is in excess of \$100,000 a year. Certificates of Obligation cannot be used to pay salaries, says Turner, so tax money, existing or new funds, would be required for this expense.

Turner points out that the grant money secured for mapping the county must be used by September 30 or it's lost. "As of this point, the county is no further along on 911 than it was two years ago," he said.

De Leon Mayor Charles Chupp said, "De Leon feels the citizens of the county deserve 911 and the government of De Leon feels we should do anything we can to get it installed as quickly as possible."
