#### Jeffrey M. Yancey Service Aboard the **USS Truxtun**

June 23 (FHTNC) - Navy Petty Officer 2nd Class Jeffrey M. Yancey, a 1988 graduate of De Leon High School, is currently deployed aboard the guided missile crusier USS Truxtun, homeported in Bremerton, Wash., and is midway through a sixmonth deployment to the Western Pacific and Persion Gulf as part of the aircraft carrier USS Nimitz Battle Group.

During the deployment, the battle group has participated in Operation Southern Watch, enforcing the United Nations-imposed "no-fly" zone over Southern Iraq, as well as in numerous naval air and surface training exercises with armed forces from Thialand, Malaysia and Singa-

Yancey has visited Jeddah, Saudi Arabia and Melbourne, Australia.

USS Truxtun was the first nuclearpowered surface ship to visit Melbourne in nearly 15 years. While there, the crew enjoyed the city's Moomba Festival, a Mardi-Gras-like celebration.

Nuclear-powered, guided missile cruisers such as USS Truxtun are multi-mission surface combatants capable of supporting carrier or battleship battle groups and amphibious forces. They are capable of operating independently or as flagships for surface action groups.

The deployment exemplifies the new Navy and Marice Corps policy, entitled "...From the Sea," in which, on short notice, U. S. forces are poised to respond to crises in distant lands, from the sea.

Prior to her work with the Office of Field Services, Dr. Heathington had worked in the Bureay of Educational Research and Service, with a two-year leave of absence in 1978-80, during which she taught reading inn the Reading Center at the University of Maryland.

Dr. Heathington has gained national recognition for her work in the field of reading. Recently, she was elected president-elect of the College Reading Association (CRA). In November of 1990, she received the CRA outstanding service award for her work in the organization. Dr. Heathington regularly has presented papers at state, regional, and national conferences in the areas of field studies and reading. She has contributed to scholarly journals and written textbooks in the field of reading.






