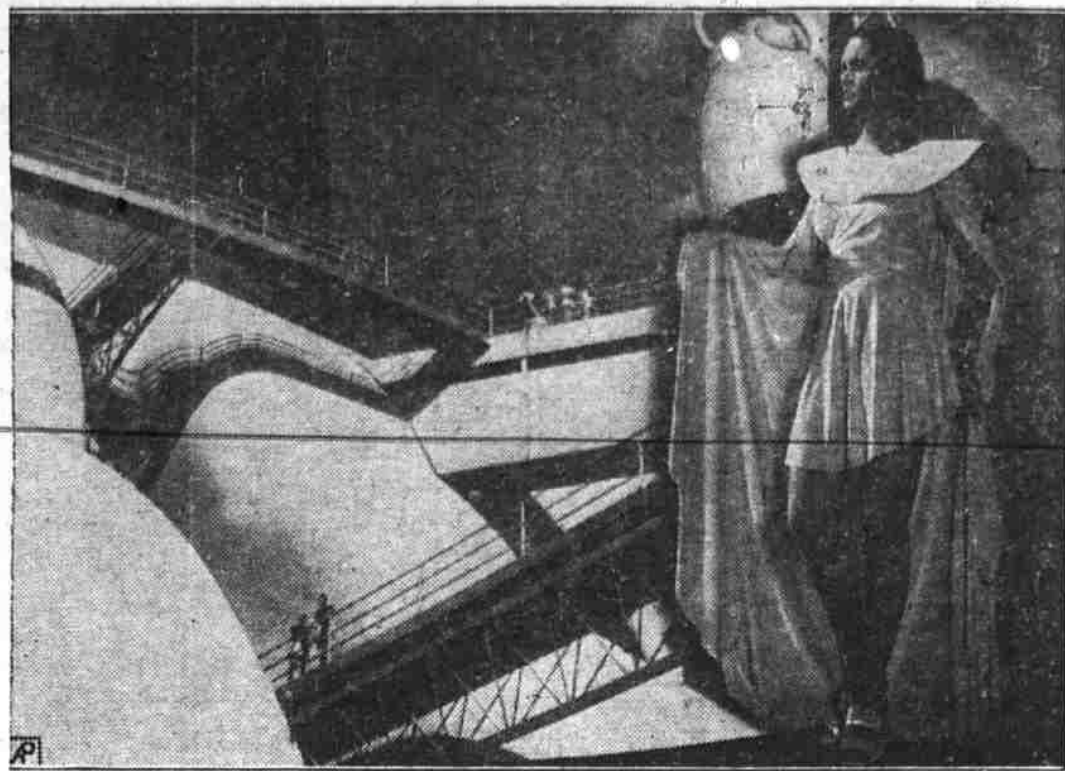
Relatives Of Judge J. T. Brooks Conclude Visit

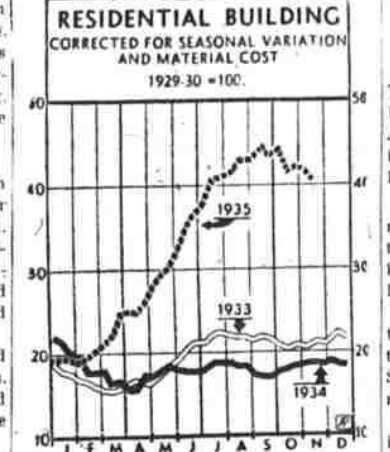

Residential Construction Is 85 Per Cent Above That In 1934

NEW YORK, Dec. 30. (UP)—America dug away the depression debris and began again, in respectable quantities, to build homes in 1935.

Home construction for outstripped other forms of building in the rate of its climb. The Associated Press seasonally adjusted index for this classification had improved by late 1935 to the best levels since early 1932.
