The Eastland County Sheriff's Teen Court program has been in operation for two sessions and has so far enjoyed tremendous success with all the young people involved as well as their parents and various individuals from throughout the county who have donated their time, effort and funds into iys creation. Sheriff Ronnie White and Chief Juvenile Probation Officer have worked tirelessly for over a year in overseeing the project and assisting however necessary to get the project "off the ground". 

The completed application forms must be filed with the Eastland County Appraisal District by April 30, 1993 if they are to be considered timely filed.

There are numerous property tax exemtpions and/or special valuations available through the State Property Tax Code. A partial list of these is shown at the end of this article. If a property owner has a question as to his or her eligibility, they should contact the Eastland County Appraisal District for assist-

Homeowners can take advantage of the partial homestead exemption available. This exemption request must be filed for by the April 30th deadline. It does not have to be re-applied for each year. If the residential homestead owner resides in the same house for 1993 that he or

she lived in for 1992 and they received a homestead exemption for 1992; they do nor need to re-apply for 1993. An exception to this would be a person who received the exemption last year (1992) but turned sixty-five (65) during the 1992 year. This person would need to re-apply as he or she would be eligible for additional exemption amounts available to those residential homestead owners over sixty-five (65) uears of age.

If you have a question as to whether you are receiving a homestead exemption or as to your eligibility for one of the available exemptions or special valuations, please contact the Eastland County Appraisal District for assistance.





# Tax Deferral Available For Over 65 Residential **Homestead Owners**

Section 33.06 of the State Property Tax Code requires the following informaiton concerning the Deferral of Certain Property Taxes to be publicized.

Property taxes on the residence homestead property of those persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older may be deferred or abated if they satisfy the requirements of the State Property Tax Code.

The property owner must occupy the residence homestead on which the tax is being levied or on which a suit has been filed for collection of delinquent taxes.

To obtain a deferral, the individual must file with the Chief Appraiser for the Appraisal District in which the property is located, an affidavit stating that he or she is sixty-five (65) years of age or older and that he or she does own and reside in the residence that the tax is being levied on.

If a suit has already been filed by a tax unit, the individual must file with the court in which the suit was filed the same type of affidavit.

By filing the affidavit with the proper authority, the payment of taxes or forced collections throught suit is postponed until the person filing the affidavit no longer owns and occupies the property as a residence homestead.

Although the tax is deferred; it is not cancelled. A tax lien remains on the property and penalties and/or interest may continue to accrue during the period that the collection of taxes is deferre.




