
James Felix Wood Laid to Rest






STENHOLM ANNOUNCES E-RATE FUNDING FOR EASTLAND COUNTY SCHOOLS AND LIBRARY

Congressman Charlie Stenholm announced today that school districts and a library in Eastland County have received E-rate funding from the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC). This money will be used to help the schools and library develop telecommunications services, Internet access, and internal connections.

In Eastland County, the following schools and library received funding: Cisco I.S.D. \$23,896.49 Rising Star S.D. \$21,400.51 Eastland I.S.D. \$41,112.00 Ranger I.S.D. \$21,007.50 Gorman I.S.D. \$24,118.10 Ranger Public Library \$1,255.41

"I support programs like the E-rate that result in direct services to rural areas," Congressman Stenholm said. "By helping rural and under-funded school districts provide current technology for their students, the E-rate is helping to ensure that equal educational opportunities are available to students across the nation, regardless of location or income."

The E-rate program was created as a part of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 to ensure that all eligible schools and libraries in the United States have affordable access to modern telecommunications and information services. Application is open to all public and private K-12 schools and public libraries. Discount funding is calculated according to a school's level of economic disadvantage (based on percentage of students eligible for the national school lunch program) and their location, rural or urban.
