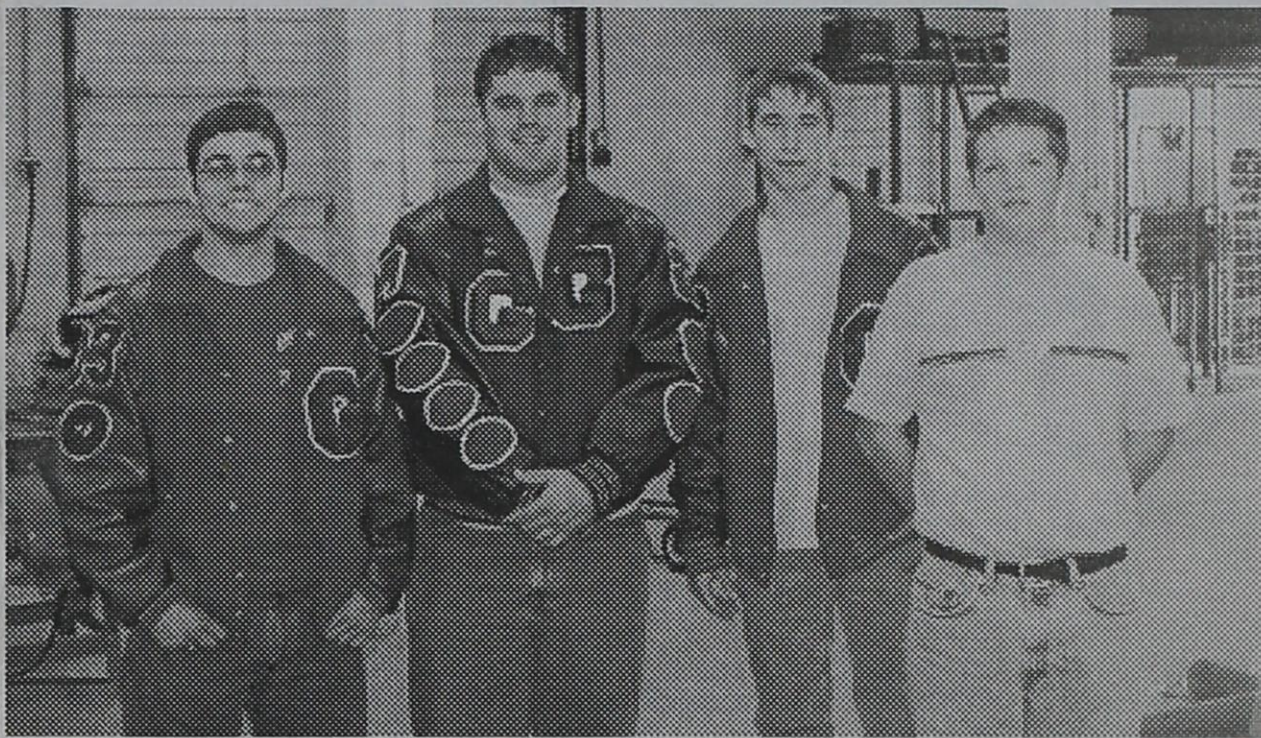

## Levi McMillan

Levi McMillan, 82, of Amarillo, died Friday, Oct. 25, 2002. Services were Monday, October 28, 2002 in Schooler Funeral Home, Brentwood Chapel, with Jim Loper, Pastor of Cornerstone Church in Borger, and the Rev. Terry Tamplen, of Kingswood United Methodist Church in Amarillo, officiating. Burial was in Llano Cemetery.

Mr. McMillan served in the Marines during World War II. He married Billie Eldridge in Gorman on May 26, 1945. He then moved to Borger in 1951 where he retired from the Phillips Plant in 1964. He worked as a sales manager for Cooper Buick Pontiac for 17 years before retiring in 1982. He was a Mason and a Shriner and had recently been honored with his 50-year Masonic membership. He was formerly a member of Wesley United Methodist Church in Borger and then moved to Kingswood United Methodist Church of Amarillo.

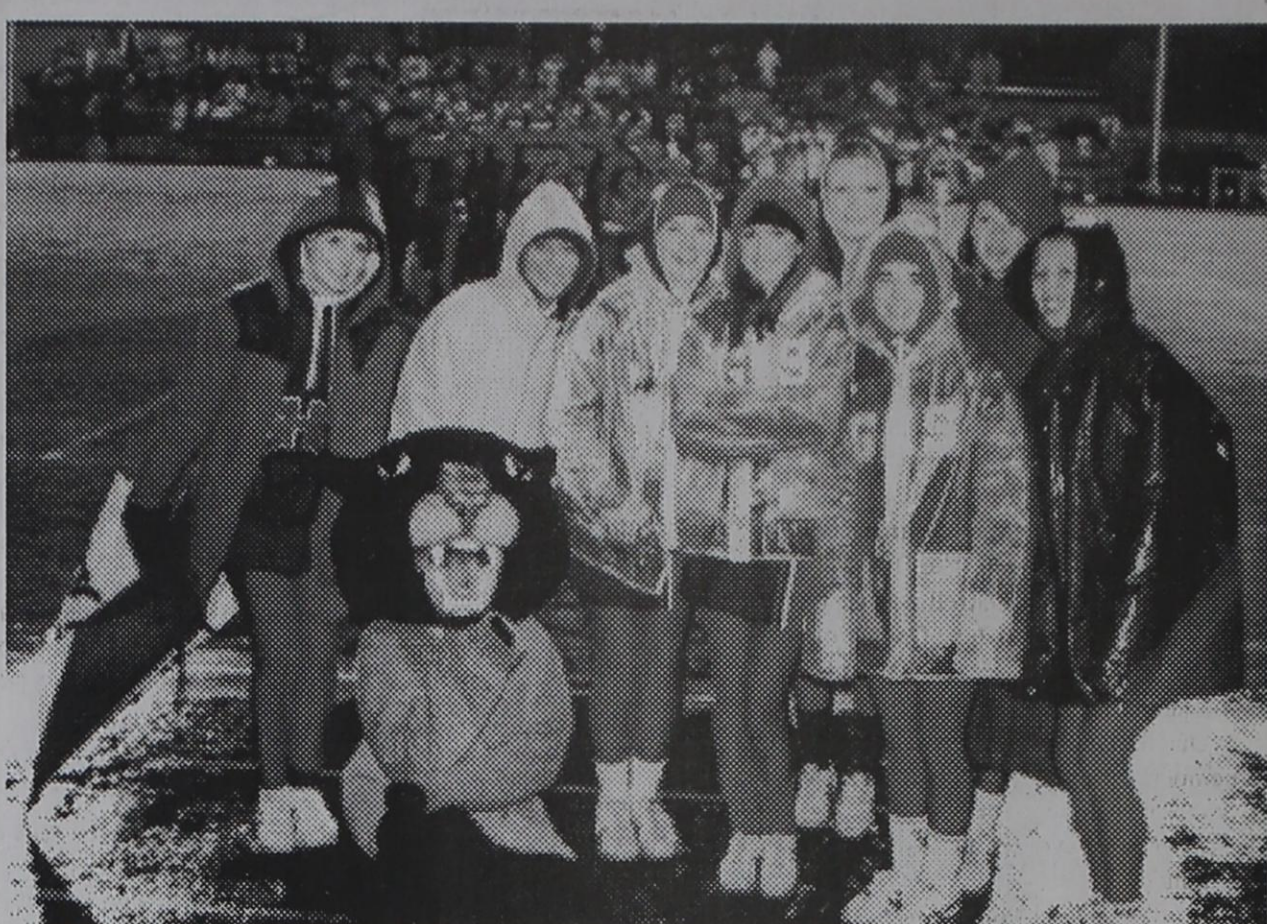
