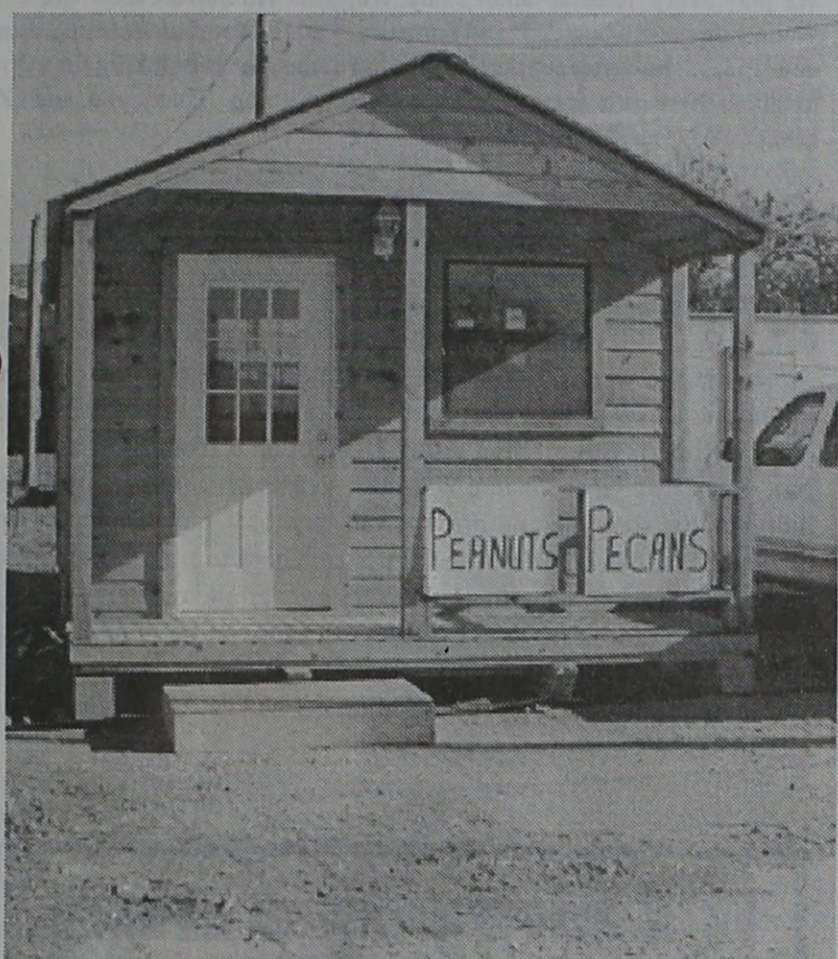

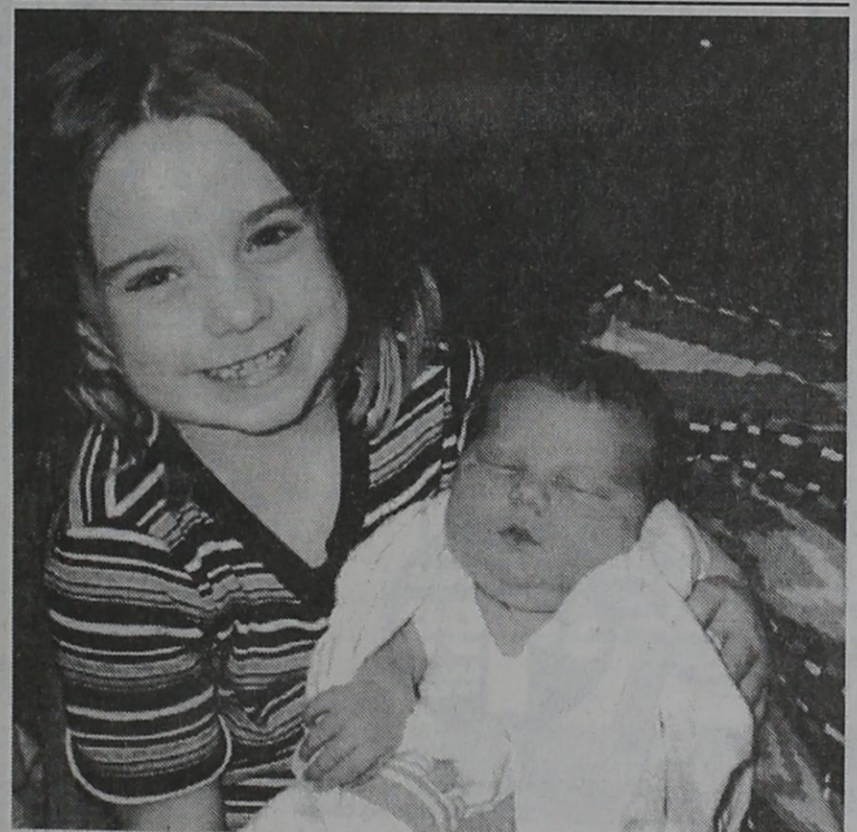
Hirst Nut and Produce Co. Gorman GROW Tour of Homes Spotlight Now Open In Gorman
