current state law, students must pass all sections of the test in order to receive a high school diploma.

## Farm Bill Update

While this legislation was scheduled t
there is now uncertainty about its future.
Recent reports from the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) and the
White House Omice of White House Office of Management and Budget (OMB) indicate that he government will return to the practice of using funds borrowed from the rest of the budget.
I support the priorities President Bush has outlined, including srengthening our national defense, meeting our commitments to veterns and providing resources for schools to meet the goals of education reform.
And as a congressman who represents a rural and agricultural disrict, I am committed to maintaining an agricultural economy that pro-
vides our nation with the food and fiber we need to guarantee our own national security.
However, I am concerned about moving forward with spending that ould be financed by borrowing from the Medicare and Social Security rust funds. This is money har has aready bed dor future enerations
urity and Medicare surplus until there is lis that spends the Social Se ing on defense, education, agriculture and other items fits into a responsible federal budget framework.
I want to work with the President in an effort to meet priorities, but his becomes very difficuit when he says he win veto any bills that are over and above the established budget. These include the defense bill,
the agriculture bill, the energy bill, and the pharmaceutical benefits bill. It's time for accountability and I hope the House leadership will not bring the farm bill to the floor at this time under these conditions.
