





### DUST ROSES FOR MILDEW

COLLEGE STATION, July 10 .-Mildrew on roses may be controlled by spraying with bordeoux mixture or by dusting the bushes with a good coat of finely ground sulphur. Sadie Hatfield, extenison speciaist in landscape gardening says that because some home gardeners object to marring their plants with vellow dust, it now is possible to obtain in some places sulphur which has been dyed green. The symptoms of mildew, which s encouraged by excess moisture, is the grayish-white appearance of the leaves. They look as though they had been dustd with flour or c ashes, and curl up and eventually die. Buds often fail to open and if they do open the bossoms are mal-
