### Lady Cubs Basketball News

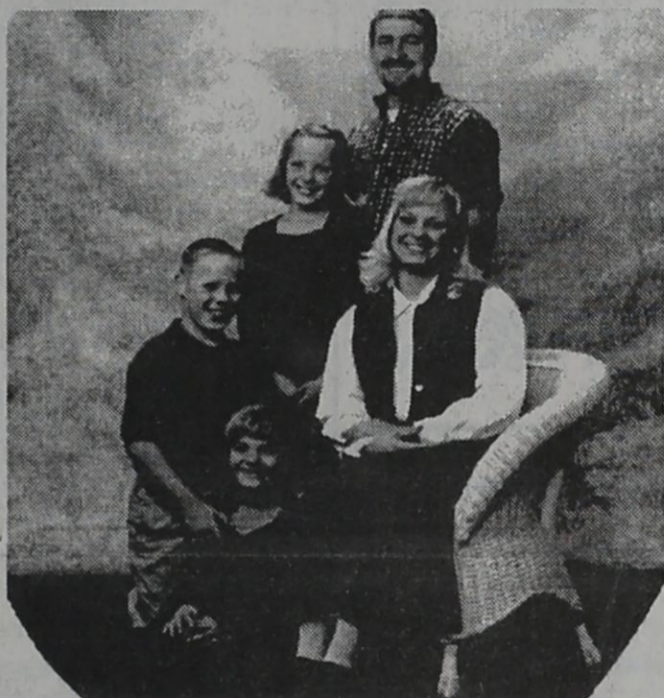

The final quarter of play had the Lady Cubs at 27 and those Lady Buffs at 14. Dezi Murphy, Olivia Jackson, Elizabeth Borrego, Audrey Johnston, Emily Lewis, Marcy Gonzalez, Valerie Longoria, and Lindsey Laminack all contributed to this victory. The 7th grade team is undefeated thus far on the 2003-2004 season (3-0).

The 8th grade girls set a good pace as they began their game on Monday night against Cross Plains as well. The first quarter ended with a 6 to 0 lead for the Lady Cubs. In the second period of the game Gorman scored 6 more and held the Lady Buffs to only 5 points leaving the game at the half 12 to 5. The third quarter had the girls playing more good defense, as they had in quarter one of the game; which led to another scoreless quarter for Cross Plains (19-5). At the end of the fourth the girls had tallied 25 and the lady Buffs only 12. 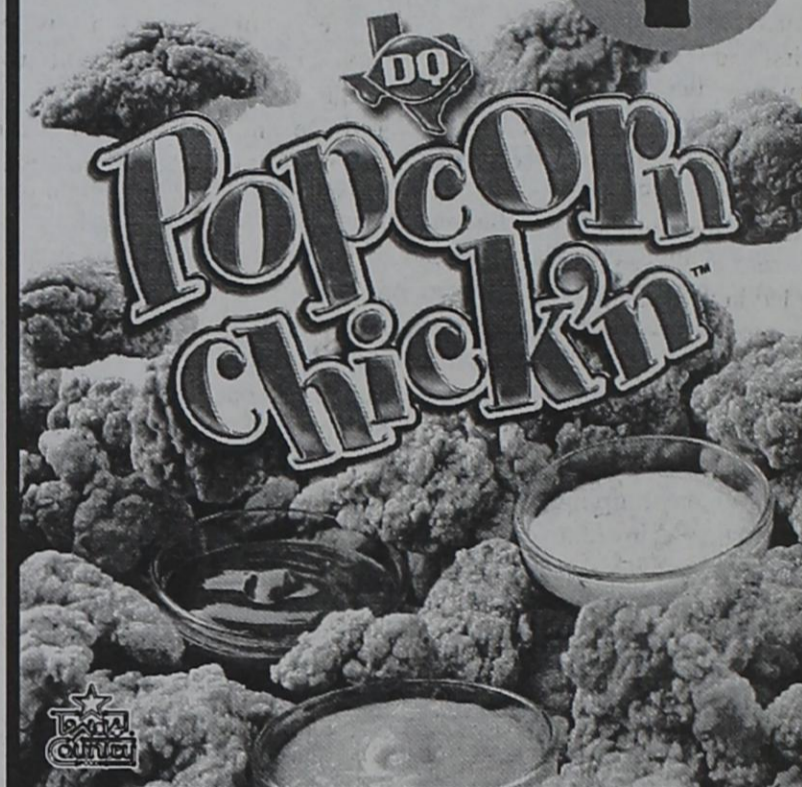
