

Release of Funds

The City of Gorman will undertake the project described above with Texas Community Development Program funds from the Office of Rural Community Affairs, under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. The City of Gorman is certifying to the Office of Rural Community Affairs that the City of Gorman and Robert Ervin, in his official capacity as Mayor, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if any action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental assessments, decision making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that, upon its approval, the City of Gorman may use Texas Community Development Program funds, and the Office of Rural Community Affairs will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and 24 CFR Part 58.

Box 12877, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711. Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by the Office of Rural Community Affairs. No objection received later than thirty-three (33) days after this publication will be considered by the Office of Rural Community Affairs.
