



Washington, D. C. - THOM-AS JEFFERSON: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal." There is no postscript to this statement which says that in some cases and under itain conditions, some people must be considered more 'equal" than others.

THE EQUALITY OF MAN MUST BE RELATED to the Constitutional guarantee that all men shold have the right of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. ANYTHING BEYOND THE "RIGHTS" of man to be protected from other men, which is fundamentally the basis of legal logic, is privilege. To legislate privileges for one group is to infringe on the freedom and liberties of others.

FREEDOM OF OPPORTUNITY IN ACCORDANCE with one's ambitions, initiative and ability is one thing. Privilege and advantages at the expense of liberty and freedom for others, is another.
