I present my ideas as a resident, long-time local business owner, former city councilman and concerned citizen. Much debate has surrounded the proposed 4A tax increase for the City of Gorman. I, like many other individuals of this community, am opposed to the proposed tax increase.

There are two recent publications I would like to respond to. One being from Mayor Tom Isbell of Anson. His comments appeared in a letter to Ms. Lori Dodd of a recent mail flyer sent to the residents of Gorman entitled: "How the 4A TAX INCENTIVE will make our community STRONGER"

Mr. Isbell portrays the 4A sales tax incentive as a viable revenue source for small towns. He uses his town of Anson as an example. Gorman and Anson are similar in ways, but are very different in others. First and foremost, with the diminished presence of Birdsong we have lost a major contributor to ou economic and employment base. Subsequently, people have been displaced disposable income reduce own of Anson these are individu

Anson is approximately twice the size the Gorman allowing for a larger taxable base to generate more income. Anson is also intersected by Highways 277 and 80. It has two major highways, while Gorman fails to compare with only purchase taxable items. Anson is twighways will produce more travelers to increase and do so more at the expense of non-residents.

As in Mr. Isbell's comments the said flyer, which it's origin is unidentified indicates that tourist will support a large percentage of the burden. Realistically, this is unlikely. Occasionally an unfamiliar face is seen purchasing items in Gorman, but glance at the local businesses to see just how many tourist are
patronizing our community compared to our residents. Not many.

Both the flyer and Mr. Isbell refer to new businesses opportunities being established through the proposed tax increase, when fundamentally businesses are opposed to taxes. Taxes impose a negative effect on businesses, on the sinuating stifles growth. The flyer also states, pes are small until they are compiled one on top of the other. Pennies will turn to dollars and it will be dollars unnecessarily paid by the people of Gorman. Unfortunately, our elderly population, unemployed and those living on limited incomes which will be penalized most unfairly.
I commend the City of Gorman, as it has done a satisfactory job with only limited economic resources. Nevertheless, if there exists no deficiencies with local governmental funds there is no justification to increase any local taxes. Any other implementation only serves to unfairly take revenues from one and disburse to another. As citizens we are already taxed far in excess with further increases imminent. The American people currently bear too much tax burden. Where does it stop? Here? In fact, this tax proposal should be voted down on principle alone.
In closing, I offer a rebuttal to the statement made in the flyer that the, " 4 A Sales Tax Incentive will make our community STRONGER". There is no tax increase that will strengthen our community. It will be made stronger only by the longterm innovation, commitment and dedication of the people in our wonderful rural community. Support local businesses. Support the community. Vote your conscious on May \(7^{\text {th }}\)
