Iimits over-the-counter sales of pseudoephedrine. Pseudoephedrine is a common ingredient found in cold remedies that can be used to make methamphetamine, e.g. Sudafed.
The legislation limits access to over-the-counter sales of tablet forms of pseudoephedrine products, which must be kept behind a pharmacy
counter or in a locked case within 30 feet and in direct line of sight of counter or in a locked case within 30 feet and in direct line of sight of
the sales clerk. Sales are limited to two packages or six grams. the sales clerk. Sales are limited to two packages or six grams.
Purchasers must display a driver's license or other picture identification, and stores are required to keep a record of the customer's name date of birth, date of purchase and the pseudoephedrine product purchased; these records must be kept for two years and may be viewed by state and local law enforcement agencies.
It also requires pharmaceutical wholesalers to record and repor sales of pseudoephedrine and requires them to notify the Texa
Department of Public Safety about transactions involving suspicious Department of Public Safety about
quantities of pseudoephedrine tablets.
Criminal District Attorniey Russ Thomason stated "The primary goal
quatites of this new law is to place some reasonable limits on the accessibility
pseudoephedrine tablets being used to cook methamphetamine. These dangerous, delusional and paranoid meth cooks must be told that the cannot obtain enough pseudoephedrine to cook this drug. This law puts a very lage dent in this terrible problem that has swept through o

Last week I identified what I feel is the single greatest contributor to Last week I identified what I feel is the single greatest contributor to
interpersonal conflict and emotional pain in our lives: judging the mointerpersonal conflict and emotional pain in our lives: judging the mo-
tives of others. I call this "attaching significance" to the observable tives of others. I call this "attaching significance" to the observable
actions of others. The more significance that you attach to an action
or event, the more power you give it to frame your overall view about or event, the more power you give it to frame your overall view about
yourself, about God, about the world around you, and about life in general. And we all tend to do this. If you haven't realized this about yourself, you may be living in denial.
This principle explains how one event or series of events in one's pas
can end up defining the romainder can end up defining the remainder of a person's life. Many of us live with unresolved resentment and anger in our hearts. We may have learned
to cope with it, but it's still down in there and sometimes creeps (or leaps) o cope with it, but it's still down in there and sometimes creeps (or leaps)
out at unexpected times. Many times we think that the resentment we out at unexpected times. Many times we think that the resentment we
feel is largely attributable to the actions of someone in the past. While it
is true that people hurt people it is very inportant to is true that people hurt people, it is very important to realize that it is
seldom the past events themselves that make us feel the way we do today. We tend to remember how an event made us feel rather than exactly what happened. And how we feel about a past event is largely a creation of
our own making. Let me illustrate. Let's say there are two boys, each from differen
ackgrounds and home situations. Both of them grow up with absentee backgrounds and home situations. Both of them grow up with absentee
dads. Their dads never attended their school activities or ball games. dads. Their dads never attended their school activities or ball games.
They didn't go to church with them or take them fishing or camping. That's the observable events, the plain facts of the matter. But let's say. That's the observable events, the plain facts of the mater. But
the reason for each of these dads being absent is very different. The first dad is absent because ehe's an angry, abusive, workaholic.
The other dad is absent because he's an officer in U.S. Marines serving in The other dad is absent because he's an officer in U.S. Marines serving in
Iraq. It is probable that the second boy will not incur the same emotional Iraq. It is probable that the second boy will not incur the same emotional
pain or baggage. Because he is less likely to attach "negative" significance to his dad's actions. He may see his dad as a brave man putting his
life on the line for his own family and his country. But the first bo life on the line for his own family and his country. But the first boy
would be greatly tempted to turn his dad's poor lifestyle decisions into statement of his own personal worth: "Dad was never there for me bestause he didn't think I was as important asshis work or his drinking bud-
