

insulin causing weight loss, increase muscle development and improve athletic performance?

Dr. Mary Bielamoqicz, a Registered Dietitian with the Texas Agricultural Extesnion Service, states that "claims that the general public and athletes need chromium supplementation because of chromium-poor diets is unwarranted due to insufficient data to support that it incrased weight loss and imprves athletic performance. All youth interested in attending However, research lacks sufficient data to warrant recommending chromium for these reasons.

Chromium - an essential trace meineral - is present in may foods naturally such as whole grains, brewer's cheese, mushrooms, and beer. The safe amount for individuals to consume daily is from 50 micrograms to 200 micrograms for adults. No recommended daily allowance for chromium has been established, however.

Chromium - is considered to be an essential part of the glucose-tolerance factor associated with insulin in the glucose. It augments the effect of proper metabolism of blood insulin, and may also influence protein and lipid metabolism. Ohter processes influenced are believed to be the formaion of muscle carbohydrate stores of glycogen and in the transport of the building blocks of protein-amino acids-in the muscles.

In a recent study, the effect of chromium picolinate on football players during spring training revealed no significant changes in strength or body composition. In this nine-week study, subjects were given 200 micrograms per day of chromium picolinate.





COASTAL GRASS Several growers have expressed concerns about coastal grass that is beginning to hear out. Certainly these concerns are warranted when we consider that grass protein begins to drop at this point. However, in the cases I have inspected most of the heading is in slight numbers when compared to the growth and upright shoots of the entire plant.

Before harvesting the grass, you must consider potential tonnage. Many of the acres in question were fertilized relatively late (in the past 2 weeks). Let's give the fertilizer time to catch up and benefit the grass and in turn harvest an amount (tonnage wise) that we can live with. If we don't wait, then cost per bale of hay from the fertilizer standpoints will be astronomical.

All we really need is a good 2 inch rain and as this writing on Thursday, May 25th, we still have not received it. Hopefully by the time you read this statement (2 inches of rain needed) it will be outdated.

Wait a minute ----- It's starting to RAIN out there!!!




