## Viewpoint

### COASTAL GRASS

Several growers have expressed

concerns about coastal grass that is beginning to hear out. Certainly these concerns are warranted when we consider that grass protein begins to drop at this point. However, in the cases I have inspected most of the heading is in slight numbers when compared to the growth and upright shoots of the entire plant.

Before harvesting the grass, you must consider potential tonnage. Many of the acres in question were fertilized relatively late (in the past 2 weeks). Let's give the fertilizer time to catch up and benefit the grass and in turn harvest an amount (tonnage wise) that we can live with. If we don't wait, then cost per bale of hay from the fertilizer standpoints will be astronomical.

All we really need is a good 2 inch rain and as this writing on Thursday, May 25th, we still have not received it. Hopefully by the time you read this statement (2 inches of rain needed) it will be outdated.

Wait a minute ----- It's starting to RAIN out there!!!
