



Child Passenger Safety

With Christmas just around the corner, this means that we will be traveling to see friends and family. They maybe across the state or they maybe just across town, either way we need to make sure that our kids are safe during this trip. Motor vehicle crashes are the #1 killer of kids. Why? In many cases, children are either not properly buckled into their safety seats or parents don't realize that a booster seat is vital to ensuring children fit safely in their vehicle seat belts. On average, 7 out of 10 car seats are not installed correctly. For the most part, it's only minor things, but they can become dangerous if not caught. Example, seat belt not pulled tight enough to secure the seat, seat not a the correct angle for rear-facing infants, seat turned around too soon, internal straps are not tight enough or positioned correctly, and the list can go on.

In Texas, the law states; "if the child is BOTH less than 5 years old and less than 36 inches tall, they are required to be in either a car seat or booster seat." It's recommended that infants remain rear-facing as long as possible, and that children in booster seats remain in those seats for as long as possible, at least until they reach the maximum weight limit of the seat. As with any child safety seat, they should NEVER be placed in front of an active air bag, doing so can cause serious injury to the child including death.

Children that have out grown their boosters seat and are able to She was welcomed home by big sister, Dana and many loving sit in the vehicle seat with a seat belt should make sure that the seat belt fits them properly. Allowing the belt to ride up on the child's abdomen or neck can cause severe injuries to the child's neck and internal organs during a crash.

If you would like to have your seat checked before hitting the road for Christmas, please call our office at 254-734-5989 for a free seat inspection. If you need a seat, we still have some convertible seats and a few boosters seats left. These are free to those that are not able to purchase a new one. What better way to say, "I love you" to your child than making sure their seats are installed and working properly, or getting a new seat for them.

We want you and your family to have a safe and happy holiday season, so please set an example and buckle up.
