## **3rd Annual Doodle Bug Train Cancelled Due To Flood**

The 3rd annual October Doodle Bug Excursion Train ride between Dublin, DeLeon and Gorman has been canceled due to flood damage along the route.

Cliffa Vaughn of Gorman, who originated the idea of the reviving the Doodle Bug ride and spearheaded its successful runs in 2005 and 2006 said, "we are disappointed, but Fort Worth & Western Railroad considers the rails to be unsafe for passenger train travel and we concur that passenger safety has to be our number one priority."

She said the railroad plans to begin repairs on the section of track, which is known as the Peanut Line, in September. The project will not be completed for several months. FWWR will work with the three communities sponsoring the annual passenger train excursion to reschedule a new date, Vaughn said.

Members of the Doodle Bug planning committee have been calling the 200 ticket holders notifying them of the cancellation. "People love train rides so it is a disappointing message we are delivering, but we are telling them about the Austin Steam Train which runs in the Hill Country in case they just can't wait for us to shout 'All Aboard the Doodle Bug'

"The 2007 Doodle Bug had been fully booked almost from the moment we pulled into the station last year and we already had more than 100 passengers reserving spots for 2008," Vaughn said. The passengers names will be transferred to the next trip unless they asked to be removed from the list.

The Doodle Bug is the name given to the train that slowly doodled it way from Waco through West Texas making passenger and mail stops at every town. Vaughn came up with the idea of reviving the train ride between the three communities when Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development Corporation representatives from the three cities were looking for a joint project. ## **MCL Coliform Violation (TCR 22)**

The City of Gorman, PWS #0670003 water system collected (2) water samples during July, 2007 that contained coliform bacteria. This water system is required to submit a minimum of two (2) routine water samples each month for bacteriological analysis. Two (2) routine samples were coliform-found and five (5) repeat samples were coliform-found for the month and year indicated above.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) sets drinking water standards in Texas and has determined that the presence of total coliform is a possible health concern. Coliforms are bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms wer found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.

For water systems analyzing at least 49 samples per month, no more than five (5) percent of the monthly samples may be positive for total coliform. For systems analyzing fewer than 40 samples per month, no more than one (1) sample per month may be positive for total coliform.



## **County Not To Be Responsible For New Construction Debris**

Judge Rex Fields office is receiving calls concerning debris that will be created when homes are demolished to make way for new construction or clearing of lots. I was in a meeting last week in Austin with FEMA and state personnel and asked them about debris from demolition work. These officials stated that FEMA will not reimburse Eastland County for expenses related to the removal of this type of demo or any new construction debris. As the homeowner, you need to make sure that your private contractor is going to be responsible for completely removing debris from their demolition and construction work. My advice to homeowners is to obtain a written and signed contract with your contractor that specifically addresses debris removal. As Eastland County will not be reimbursed by FEMA for this type of removal, the County will not be responsible for demolition and new construction debris removal.

The County through its contractor, Eagle Construction will continue to remove the flood-related debris that has been placed in front of homes on county roads in the Lake Leon area, but will be unable to remove new debris from demolition. The first week of debris removal has gone well with the majority of the north side of Lake Leon being cleaned and the effort has started on the south side near the dam. I drove around the Lake Saturday afternoon and the situation already looks vastly improved. I sincerely hope that life at Lake Leon is beginning to return to normal. Eastland County and Eagle Construction will continue to remove the floodrelated debris.

I want to state again my appreciation to everyone affected for your patience in this process. We are on moving forward.





# Information On School Meal Programs

### **Child Nutrition Program Payment Collection Procedure**

The Gorman ISD cafeteria provides nutritious meals for students each day. Students who do not have an approved application on file for the free meal program are required to pay for their meals. Parents or students may pay for meals in advance during the school day in the elementary office or in the cafeteria. Students in PK through 3rd grade will give their lunch money to their teacher at the beginning of the school day. Students in 4th through 12th grades will pay for or charge meals as they receive them. Charging meals is allowed only to the amount of \$25.00 per student. Students will not be allowed to charge meals after they reach the \$25.00 limit unless

arrangements have been made in the office or their bill is paid in full. If you do not want your child to be allowed to charge meals please contact Debbie Burleson at 734-2617 or Gena Rone at 734-2521. Lunch bills will be mailed twice a month.

Students or households owing a bill from the last school year will not be allowed to charge until their bill is cleared.

If your children received child nutrition program benefits at the end of school last year they will receive the same benefits at the beginning of school for a "grace period" of time until your new application has been approved in the office.

### Please note:

The amount on your check for meal payment will be applied to your child's account in the lunchroom. We do not cash checks or give back change from checks for other programs or reasons. One check may be written for all children in the same household.

Breakfast is served to all students free of charge due to participation in the "Breakfast in the Classroom" Program.

Reduced price lunch is \$ .40

Elementary lunches \$1.25 Junior High and High School lunches \$1.50

Salad bar is \$1.50.

School employees pay \$2.25 for tray meals. Adult visitors pay \$3.00 for tray meals.

A Humanitarian Without Peer

A ceremony was held in Washington on July 17 to honor a humble man who arguably saved more lives than anyone in history. Norman E. Borlaug, 93, was presented with the Congressional Gold Medal for his life's work in developing and spreading modern agriculture practices around the world.

A columnist recently called Norman Borlaug "the greatest living American." At a time of rapid population growth worldwide, Borlaug pioneered genetic advances and farming techniques that have kept the world's food supply growing faster than the population.

Norman Borlaug, the father of the Green Revolution, is credited with preventing more than one billion souls from starvation in underdeveloped countries. His achievement is unparalleled, and he has received almost every humanitarian honor, from the Presidential Medal of Freedom to the Nobel Prize. I was proud to co-sponsor the bill to provide him the Congressional Gold Medal

Borlaug was born on a farm in Saude, Iowa in 1914. His service to the world was shaped by his Depression-era experiences. "You'd see young people asking for a nickel to buy bread, and older people sleeping in the park," he recently told the Dallas Morning News.

"We were a pretty sick nation at that time. It made me tough. I was angry that this kind of condition could exist and persist in our own society."

After doing wartime duty at a DuPont laboratory, Dr. Borlaug was sent by the Rockefeller Foundation to Mexico in 1944 to do agricultural research. Mexico then was a net importer of grain, with most production from subsistence farmers.

Borlaug spent ten years breeding wheat cultivars resistant to disease, especially rust. He was able to speed up his work by taking advantage of Mexico's two growing seasons.

A major breakthrough occurred when Borlaug switched from tall, thin varieties of wheat-stalks that collapsed under the weight of heavy wheat grain-to a Japanese semi-dwarf variety with shorter, stronger stalks. By 1963, Mexico's wheat harvest was six times its 1944 total, and the country had become a grain exporter.

The Rockefeller Foundation then urged Borlaug to take his program to Pakistan and India. By this time, in the late 1960s, he was able to make even faster progress, and aid workers called the results a "green revolution."

Ironically, as this work was under way, the popular scientific community was predicting the exact opposite—namely global famine and mass starvation in Asia. The low point was in 1968, when biologist Paul R Ehrlich published a wildly-popular bestseller, "The Population Bomb."

Predicted Ehrlich: "In the 1970s and 1980s, hundreds of millions of people will starve to death in spite of any crash programs embarked upon

He was wrong, Under Borlaug's tutelage, Pakistan's wheat production went from 4.6 million tons in 1965 to 20 million tons in 2000. India also became self-sufficient quickly, going from 12 million to 76 million tons of wheat in the same period. Other Asian countries, especially China, have had similar success.

Borlaug is also an ardent conservationist. Because of increased productivity, millions of acres of trees and rain forest have been saved from destruction for cultivation around the world, to the benefit of us all.

Two decades ago, Norman and Margaret Borlaug became Texans, moving to Dallas to be closer to their family. Margaret died this year after 69 years of marriage. Dr. Borlaug still teaches one class each year at Texas A&M University in College Station, where students learn firsthand from one of mankind's greatest and most humble benefactors.

His work goes on. The Borlaug Institute at A&M concentrates on agricultural and economic advancement in more than 100 countries all over the world.

A man of faith, Norman Borlaug views the future through the words of Isaiah: "And the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose. ... And the parched ground shall become a pool, and the thirsty land springs of wa-

Start Saving on Your Prescription Drugs

Are you having trouble paying for prescription drugs? If you are and you have Medicare, there is extra help available and you may be eligible. And, if you think you won't qualify for it, think again.

One woman with Medicare was struggling to pay for her prescriptions even with a drug plan and her \$800 Social Security benefit. She talked to Monica, a counselor at the local State Health Insurance Information Program (SHIP) in Louisiana. Once she heard that the value of her house, as long as she lived in it, would not be used when determining her qualification for the extra help, she applied and qualified. She was very grateful for the extra help.

This extra help — available by applying and qualifying through Social Security can pay for part of your drug costs, for example monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and prescription co-payments. The extra help could be worth more than \$3,300 per year. Many people with limited income and resources qualify for these big savings and they don't even know it. So, be a smart consumer, and don't walk away from this extra help.

You must apply to find out if you qualify for the extra help. Apply online at www.socialsecurity.gov, call Social Security at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778), or go to the nearest Social Security office for assistance.

To qualify for extra help in 2007, your income should be no more than \$15,315 for an individual or \$20,535 for a married couple. Your income limit may be higher if you or your spouse support other family members who live with you or if you live in Alaska or Hawaii. Your resources (like bank accounts, stocks and bonds) can't be more than \$11,710 for an individual or \$23,410 for a married couple. Remember, your house and car don't count toward resources.



Protecting Our Children From Predators

Nearly every day, we read a newspaper story or see a TV report about child predators who go online in search of young prey. The social networking site, MySpace, recently took down the profiles of more than 29,000 sex offenders who had registered on their site. According to a new study, 1 in 5 children receive a sexual solicitation within the first year they use the Internet.

The increased interaction of young people in cyberspace is a new problem that MySpace and similar Web sites can't solve on their own. A real solution to this challenge requires parental common sense along with new legislation to provide law enforcement with the tools they need to bust these criminals. I am working to advance that legislation. Before adjourning for August recess, the U.S. Senate held a hearing on pro-

tecting our sons and daughters when they're surfing the web. One of the witnesses was the reigning Miss America, Lauren Nelson, who's made Internet safety her platform issue. She told the committee, "When I was 13, my friends and I made the bad decision to share personal information on the Internet with someone we later learned was a sexual predator ... We told our parents about what we had done, and the situation was defused without incident. Unfortunately ... not all stories dealing with the potential dangers of the Internet end without serious incident.'

Miss America stated that education is one of the best weapons we can use against the predators. She is right. The days of locking our doors to keep predators away from our children are gone. At a time when kids can access the Internet at any time and from a variety of places, including cell phones, parents need to be active in informing their children about online dangers.

Our local schools can also play a positive role. Last year, Virginia became the first state in the country to require Internet safety to be integrated into the public school curriculum. This is an excellent idea that should be adopted in Texas, and elsewhere.

While education is essential, we also need to give our law enforcement officials the resources they need to catch online criminals, and to prevent the crime from even happening, wherever possible.

I've seen first-hand how parents, law enforcement officials, and elected leaders can work together in a positive way to protect our kids. In 2003, I introduced a bill to create the National AMBER Alert Network to find abducted children. This legislation built on the success of the original AMBER Alert program, which was founded in North Texasto help local police find missing boys and girls. In the four years since the nationwide network was created, we have returned 336 children to their loving parents.

Earlier this year, I traveled to Austin to join First Lady Laura Bush and other leaders in announcing the creation of the Texas Regional Office for the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. During our visit, we learned how sexual predators are using loopholes in our current legal system to evade law enforcement, and put our children at risk.

To prevent future sexual crimes from happening, I have cosponsored a landmark bill called Keeping the Internet Devoid of Sexual Predators Act of 2007. This legislation will require convicted sex offenders to provide their email address, instant message screen names, and other forms of online identity to the National Sex Offender Registry.

In the past, advocacy groups like the ACLU have opposed efforts to register sexual offenders because of privacy concerns. I respect the right to privacy; however, criminals in general, and sex offenders, in particular, forfeit their privileges, including privacy protections, when they molest the most vulnerable, and innocent, members of our society. I believe that a parent's right to protect his or her children supersedes a sexual predator's right to privacy.

In the months ahead, I will work hard to pass this measure through the U.S. Senate, and have it signed into law. But no law - no matter how rigorously enforced – is a guarantee of safety.

As parents, we must remain vigilant in our children's defense. In the battles ahead, knowledge is power. I strongly encourage you to visit the Web site of the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children at www.missingkids.com. This outstanding organization has excellent tips for moms and dads to keep their kids safe. Through both education and tougher laws, we can make Texas the wholesome place we love to call home.
