EXTENSION SETS 3 DOVE
APPRECIATION DAYS ACROSS TEXAS
Widespread rainfall across Texas should mean excellent dove hunting
for much of the state, according to a Texas Cooperative Extension wildlife expert at San Angelo. "Prospects for the upcoming dove seas, which starts September 1, look quite good at this point," said Dr. Dale Rollins, Exten-
