





Blackwell Hospital Historical Marker Plague Due Shortly

Blackwell Hospital Historical Committee's goal is near completion. The official historical marker for the hospital is in hand and available to be installed. The final wording on the companion plaque honoring Dr. D. V. Rodgers has been approved and the template for the plaque has been return to the foundry for production.

Waiting on the state to send the plaque to us seemed like it took forever; this combined with some of our internal delays extended the time. By the first of last March 2006 we felt that everything was finally ready and the ball in their ballpark. We had been promised an approval sheet and the completed plaque within 90 days. In checking the last of May it was discovered that the promised approval sheet had been fixed to a cellular telephone on the 9th of March instead of sending it to a fax machine. The error has been corrected. Dr. Rodgers plaque is due shortly. That leaves the site preparation, installation and the ceremony. After coming this far that should be a piece of cake.







End to Long Distance Tax Long Overdue

On May 25, the U.S. Treasury Department announced that the federal excise tax on long distance telephone service will come to an end this summer. Americans probably have seen this tax when they have reviewed their monthly phone bills. However, what many Americans probably do not know about is the why this tax was established in the first place. As it turns out, the federal government established this excise tax in 1898 to fund the Spanish-American War. After learning about the history of the tax, I double-checked my encyclopedia. My suspicions were correct: the Spanish-American War is, in fact, over. We won.


In a Roundup from several weeks ago, I wrote about how Congress passed important tax relief measures that will help continue our country's current economic expansion. Admittedly, this latest tax relief from the Treasury Department will probably not have too much effect on the economy. The average phone users will save about twenty bucks a year. However, this situation points to broader problem in Washington: it is nearly impossible to end a federal agency, program, or tax once it is created, even if the original purpose for the program or tax no longer exists. In this case, the Spanish-American War had been over for more than a century, yet Americans were still paying taxes to support it. I guess President Reagan had it right (as he usually did) when he said that "the nearest thing to eternal life we will ever see on this earth is a government program."

It is this "eternal" nature of federal programs that has led me to believe that all programs and taxes should come up for review every ten Mears to see if they are still necessary or effective. Right now, there are efforts in the House to institute such a policy. I am very supportive of these efforts and hope to see legislation come to the floor this year.

On This Week's Agenda

The House will consider legislation this week that would increase the fines for broadcasters who put indecent material over the airwaves. The legislation raises the fine from \$32,500 per offense to \$325,000. The public, not private broadcasters, owns the airwaves. Therefore, the public, particularly parents, should be able to turn on their televisions and radios and reasonably expect not to be bombarded with indecent material and images. Since we will be voting on the Senate version of the bill, approval by the House will send this legislation to President Bush for his signature.

A 'Phoney' Tax Bill

Last month, we thought we got some great news from the U.S. Treasury. A federal "luxury" tax created to fund the Spanish-American War more than a century ago was being abolished, and most of us will get refunds for the past three years of payments.

The more I looked at how this occurred, however, the less enthusiastic I got. It's a welcome development, but it's also yet another example of how poorly we do things in Washington.

The federal excise tax on long-distance telephone service was first established in 1898 as a one-cent levy on long-distance phone calls that rang up charges of more than 15 cents. The tax was designed to target the wealthy, those who could afford telephone service.

The long-distance excise tax has increased and has been revised over the years. But as often happens, the federal government failed to keep up with advances made in telecommunications, making the tax antiquated and more suitable for the horse and buggy age rather than the Internet age. Multiple lawsuits

Last month, after five appellate courts ruled against the government, the U.S. Treasury finally announced it would terminate the tax on July 31, 2006. It also ordered the Internal Revenue Service to provide refunds, including interest, for excise taxes paid since March 2003.

Since 1982, we've all paid a three percent tax on long distance calls. If you spend \$50 a month, that could mean a \$1.50 per month refund for the past three

Texans may ask for a refund of these taxes on their 2006 federal income tax returns. Taxpayers have been assured the refund process will be simple and actual receipts for taxes paid won't be required for a refund. Taxpayers will be reimbursed an estimated \$13 billion.

If you believe in truth in packaging, we should rejoice when an obsolete tax is killed. Of course, it should have been done by Congress, and not under pressure from a court order. But how did we get to this point?

The long distance excise tax originated at the start of the Spanish American War, shortly before Lt. Col. Teddy Roosevelt and his volunteer Rough Riders pulled out of training camp at San Antonio bound for eventual glory at San Juan

The American government was having trouble paying for our military action. A Washington bureaucrat devised the long-distance phone tax as a new revenue tream to finance the war effort.

"We drew a great many recruits from Texas," wrote Roosevelt later, "and from nowhere did we get a higher average, for many of them had served in that famous body of frontier fighters, the Texas Rangers.

"Of course, these rangers needed no teaching. They were trained to obey and to take responsibility. They were splendid shots, horsemen, and trailers. They were accustomed to living in the open, to enduring great fatigue and hardship, and to encountering all kinds of danger."

After the four-month war on Spain, Congress continued to reauthorize the tax over the years. There was always a good reason-to help make ends meet for added expenses during World War I, the Great Depression, World War II and Vietnam. And many years in between.

Texans believe in meeting their responsibilities...or doing more. Texans are always the first to extend a hand, do their part, or help resolve a problem. Like those Texan Rangers-turned-Rough Riders of 100 years ago, we step forward

Today, the federal government is spending far more than what it collects. We have not done an adequate job in Washington in keeping down federal spending, which continues to outpace inflation.

Ironically, this obsolete Spanish-American war excise tax is being put to rest at a time when we once again have an actual need to mobilize our collective resources. The war on terrorism is vital to our security; it will require diligence and effort for years to come.

All of us are willing to pay our share to keep America strong and preserve our liberties. But it should be done forthrightly, with full disclosure and consent of the governed - not through a hidden fee based on a wartime emergency that has long since come and gone.

As Thomas Jefferson so aptly put it: "We must not let our rulers load us with perpetual debt." Now that a "cease fire" has been declared on a 108-year-old war tax, we should turn our attention to balancing our books and meeting our current obligations. Now is the time to hang up the telephone tax once and for all.


