completed the training. Besides hazard identification and response tech niques, each class covers propane safety topics ranging from barbecu cylinders to residential tanks and commercial bulk installations.

Chairman Michael L. Williams said, "The Commission of fers these free propane classes for local fire departments statewide. The classes familiarize firefighters with propane's physical and chemical
properties and explain the safety features of propane tanks and equipment. This is specialized training that is often not readily available els
$\qquad$ ommissioner Victor G. Carrillo noted that every class is c sponsored by one or more local propane marketers. "The 93 propane
