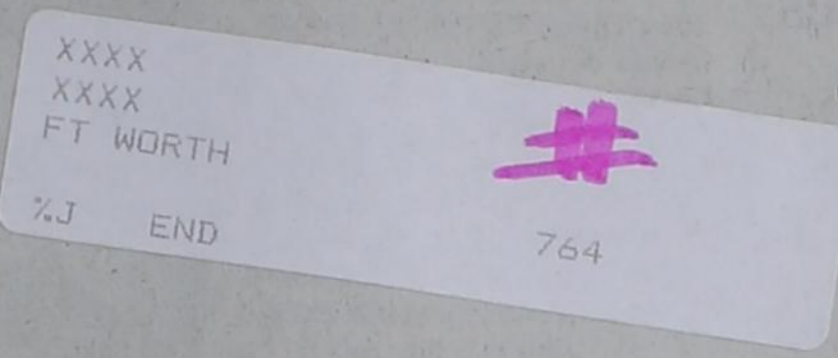

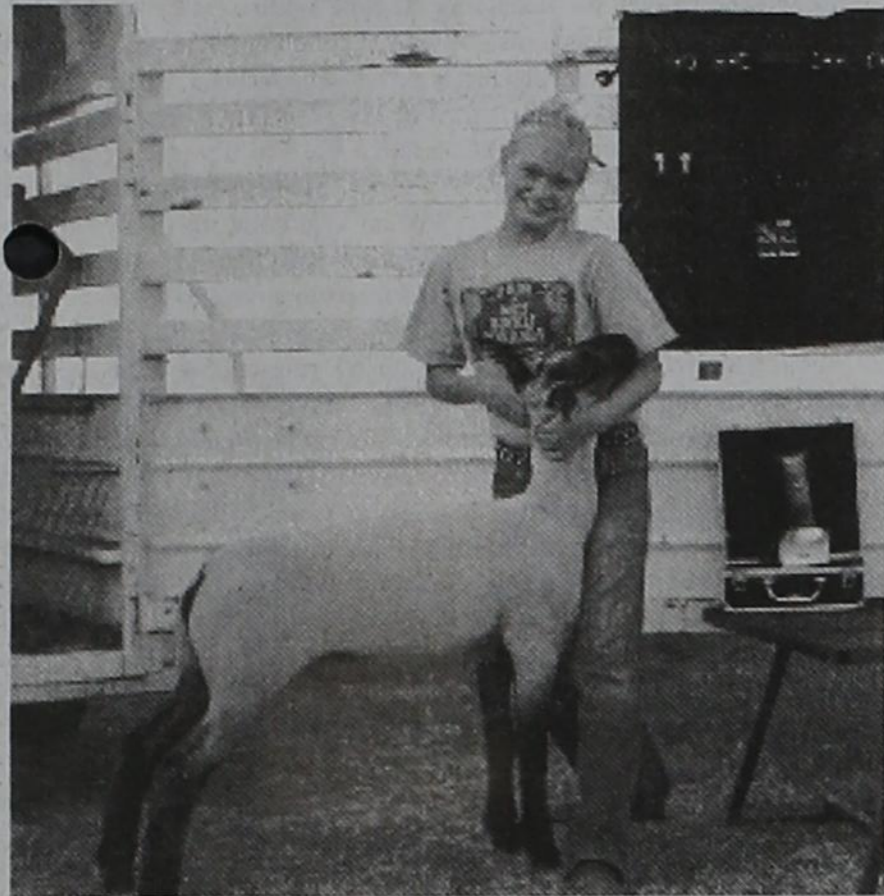

Roses in the Texas Landscape was the topic of the program by Patsy Clark at a recent meeting of the Texas Star Gardeners. The presentation featured the use of native plant materials for lawns and gardens from her own experience with references from author and Horticulturist Neil Sperry, well known gardening expert. Information included the advantages of the various types of roses in the home landscape. She also spoke from information developed by Dr. William Welch, Professor and Extension Horticulturist. Caro Boswell also presented each attendee information on "own-root propagation" for the older native roses.

Foreign high school students are scheduled to arrive soon for academic semester and year program homestays, and the sponsoring organization needs a few more local host families.

The students are all between the ages of 15 and 18 years, are English-speaking, have their own spending money, carry accident and health insurance, and are anxious to share their cultural experiences with their new American families. Pacific Intercultural Exchange currently has programs to match almost every family's needs, ranging in length from a semester to a full academic year, where the students attend local high schools.

P.I.E. area representatives match students with host families by finding common interests and lifestyles through an informal in-home meeting. Prospective host families are able to review student applications and select the perfect match. As there are no "typical" host families, P.I.E. can fit a student into just about any situation, whether it is a single parent, a childless couple, a retired couple or a large family. Families who host for P.I.E. are also eligible to claim a \$50.00 per month charitable contribution deduction on their itemized tax returns for each month they host a sponsored student.

For the upcoming programs, P.I.E. has students from Germany, the Former Soviet Republics, Venezuela, Brazil, Korea, Mexico, China and many other countries. P.I.E. is also participating in two special government-funded programs to bring scholarship students from the newly independent states of the former Soviet Union as well as predominantly Islamic countries such as Yemen, Syria, Jordan, Morocco, Kuwait, Iraq and Qatar to the United States. P.I.E. is a non-profit educational organization that has sponsored more than 25,000 students from 45 countries since its founding in 1975. The organization is designated by the United States Department of State and is listed by the Council on Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET), certifying that the organization complies with the standards set forth in CSIET's Standards for International Educational Programs.

P.I.E. Executive Director John Doty encourages families to contact the program immediately, as it will allow the proper time for the students and hosts to get to know one another before they actually meet for the first time.

Area families interested in learning more about student exchange or arranging for a meeting with a community representative may call P.I.E., toll-free at 1-888-PIE-USA1. The agency also has travel/study abroad program opportunities for American high school students as well as possibilities for community volunteers to assist and work with area host families, students and school.

Food

(NU) - Here is one U.S. Farm-Raised Catfish recipe that will make a grilled dish better than anything that comes on a bun:

Grilled Catfish Over Mixed Greens -- Serves Four

- 4 U.S. Farm-Raised Catfish fillets (4-6 oz each)
- 1 1/2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 4 cups mixed salad greens, washed and dried
- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 3 teaspoons dried tarragon
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 4 ounces white mushrooms, thinly sliced

Place fillets on a shallow plate. Mix olive oil, vinegar, tarragon, salt and pepper in a small bowl until well blended. Pour two-thirds of the marinade over the Catfish. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 30 minutes to marinate. Reserve the remaining marinade to use as salad dressing.

Prepare a grill or preheat the broiler to 500 degrees Fahrenheit. Place Catfish fillets on an oiled grill rack or broiler pan rack. Grill or broil four inches from the heat source for two to three minutes on each side or until fish flakes easily. Remove and allow to cool slightly. Serve warm.

Toss salad greens, mushrooms and the reserved marinade in a large bowl. Top with grilled Catfish.
