

The board meeting began at approximately 7:00pm. The invocation was given by Daryl Hirst and then the Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present. The board then unanimously approved the consent agenda. All regular reports were then received. The site superintendent, Tim Barton reported to the board on the progress of the building project. appreciated the opportunity he had been given to supervise the project. Superintendent Perry reported that Mr. Barton had already caught some mistakes early on and that his conscientious efforts were exactly what we needed on this type of project.

The principals reported that there was just not very much on which to report other than they had been working with students who were taking the TAKS test this summer, tutoring them in the areas where they needed help. In Mr. Perry's report, he cover the following issues: The boards endorsement of Melinda Harrington as a candidate for Region 14's place on the board of the Texas Association of School Boards; a letter given him by EastEnd Special Education Cooperative director Tommy Lee from the Coop's attorney regarding the role of Gorman ISD as fiscal agent and the revised shared services agreement; reviewed progress on the superintendent goals set for 2008-2009; and several other miscellaneous items.

The board then approved the following items unanimously: the second reading of TASB Policy Update 83; to let bids for roof repairs/ replacement specified in insurance estimate; the milk bid from Borden; the fuel bid from Gooden Petroleum, Inc.; and changes in the Child Nutrition Program including increases in meal prices. Under Personnel the board: reviewed resignations from Mr. and Mrs. Emmons and Belinda Segura; approved the hiring of Alexa Maddox as a secondary teacher on a 187 day probationary contract; approved increasing the nurses number of days by 50% and her hourly rate by 10%; and approved the hiring of Cheryl Glover as a diagnostician and Lanette Trainham as a speech pathologist for the 2008-2009 school year for the EastEnd Coop each on 200 day contracts. The meeting adjourned at 9:30pm.

I am sure that if you are driving by the building project periodically you are seeing the good progress they are making. It is except to watch the project develop. The weather has cooperated and we congot some rain to boot.

We are excited about the possibilities that Coach Hendrix is bringing to Gorman. If you have not met him, you'll have your chance soon enough after two-a-days begin in August. He has been here and has been doing a lot of planning and work to get ready for our athletes return. So has Coach Gerick and Coach Bates. We are also very excited to get Mrs. Hendrix as a girl's coach. It is our hope that her previous experiences will help our girl's achieve more than they ever have before. 




