NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION FOR TPDES PERMIT FOR MUNICIPAL WASTEWATER RENEWAL

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION. City of Gorman, P.O. Box 236, Gorman, Texas 764440236, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a renewal of TPDES Permit No. 10091-001, which authorizes the discharge of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 120,000 gallons per day. TCEQ received this application on August 22, 2008.

The facility is located southwest of the City of Gorman, west of Farm-to-Market Road 79 (Crescent Street) in Eastland County, Texas. The treated effluent is discharged to an unnamed tributary; thence to Shinoak Branch, thence to the Sabana River, thence to Lake Proctor in Segment No. 1222 of the Brazos River Basin. The unclassified receiving water uses are limited to aquatic life uses for an unnamed tributary and high aquatic life uses for Shinoak Branch. The designated uses for Segment No. 1222 are high aquatic life use, public water supply, and contact recreation. All determinations are preliminary and subject to additional review and/or revisions.
The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. The permit application, Executive Director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at Gorman

PUBLIC COMMENT/PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting about this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ holds a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant hearing.

OPPORTINUTY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision. A contested case hearing is a legal oceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name; address, phone; applicant's name and permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; and the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify as individual member of the group who would group's representative for receiving future correspondence; idenify as infermation discussed above regarding the
be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the informater affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are germane to the group's purpose.

The Commission will only grant a contested case hearing on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material o the Commission's decision on the applications. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION. The Executive Director may issue final approval of the application unless a timely contested case hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed. If a timely hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed, the Executive Director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and request to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.
