Records must be kept through the feeding period and turned in to the superintendent on show day. The use of a display to show herd genetics or any other EPD is recommend herd
ed.

Heifers will be shown in pens of one without a halter. Each exhibitor may enter 3 head. Pens will be set up for contestants befor Wednesday arrival at which time they will be weighed and assigned a pen

Heifers will be shown on Thurs day and must remain in the pens so potential buyers can inspect the cattle. Exhibitors must be present when the heifers are judged unless previ ously excused by the superintendent.

Heads may be clipped, but no other fitting or clipping will be allowed. Any heifer with paints, adhesives, or any other fitting product will be disqualified
10. Exhibitors will not go through the remium sale. Once the show is over, the heif ers are to be taken to Texas Cattle Exchange and will be marketed at the Eastland County Live stock Show Commercial Heifer Sale during the weekly cattle auction the following Tuesday.
11. Exhibitors will declare if the heifer is bred or open for sale purposes
12. Heifers will be divided into ag and breed classes: 12-18 months \& 18-24 months American, European and British breeds
