Notes From Dr. Dan

You know, having a smoking section in a restaurant is kinda like having a peeing section in a swimming pool.

Swimming is a big part of summer... especially for us kids. I recently got swimmer's ear and it stopped my swimming abruptly. I had forgotten the easiest way to prevent swimmer's ear. 
